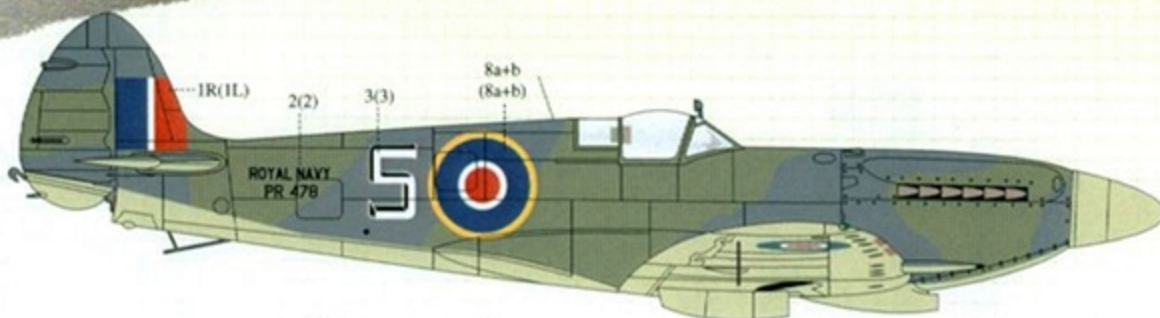

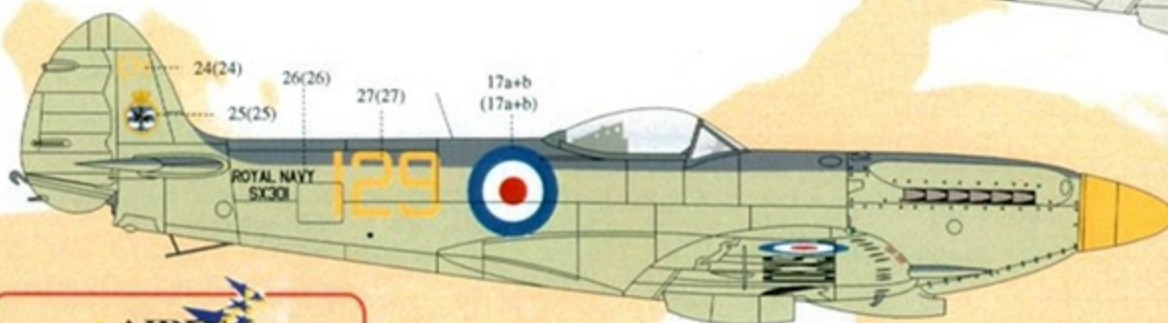

Seafire Mk.XV PR478 S. 803 Squadron, Nutts Corner, Northern Ireland, December 1945. PR478 is shown just prior to the unit and its aircraft being transferred to the Royal Canadian Navy. Note the unusual style of the fuselage code letter 'S'.



Seafire Mk.XV SW768 114/Y
802 Squadron, HMS Glory, September 1946. SW768 carries the BPF carrier code 'Y' for HMS Glory and roundel and bar markings for this theatre. Spinner is Blue with a White band and back plate.

Seafire Mk.XV PR434 AA-J
883 Squadron, RCN, RCNAS Dartmouth, 1948. PR434 carries the then new RCN scheme of Extra Dark Sea Grey upper surfaces and Sky Grey sides and under surfaces. This period also saw the introduction of the Canadian Maple Leaf insignia within the roundel.



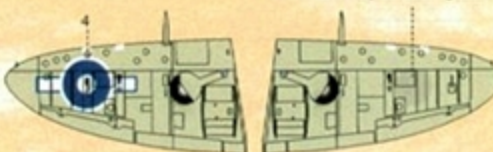
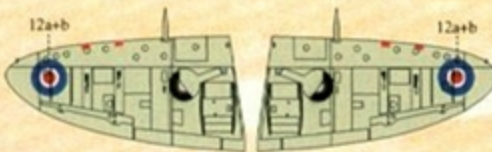
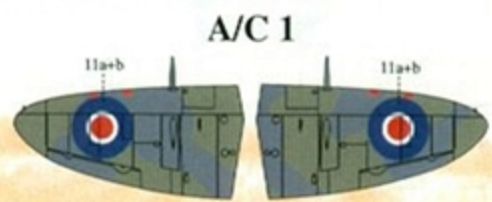
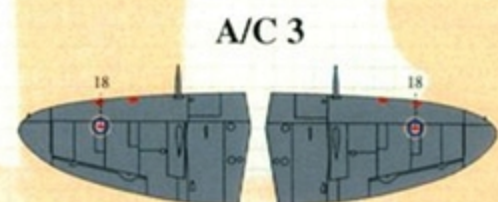
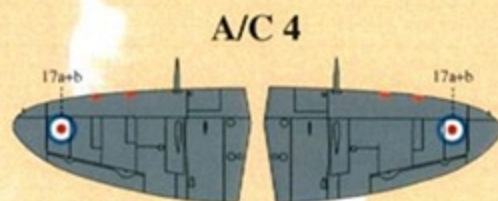
Seafire Mk.17 SX301 129/CH
