





# **Notes on Specific Aircraft**

#### White 5

SS1 Fw 190As had several modifications made once the aircraft were delivered to the unit. Large armored panels
were added to the fuselage sides, usually consisting of two or three individual panels per side. A special streamlined
canopy was used (see diagram on back page of color instructions) which had additional armor added to the basic
canopy. Finally, to compensate for the added weight of the armored panels, the cowl guns were removed. No fairings were used over the openings, so simply cut off your kit guns and you'll be fine.

- The SS1 badge was on the port side in photos, and we doubt it was ever applied to the starboard side. An extra is
  included in case new photos appear.
- When first delivered, the spinner was RLM 70 (as shown on profile), but all aircraft later received the standard black & white spiral.

### White 14

- See above notes regarding SS1 modifications to their Fw 190As.
- While our photo was of the starboard side and had no unit badge, we believe it was applied to the port cowl in the same position as White 5.

#### Green Double Chevron

- This aircraft has been depicted INCORRECTLY numerous times. Several artist have shown a green rudder and sometimes cowl stripe for this Fw 190F-8. THIS IS WRONG! The cowl stripe & rudder were painted yellow for air to ground recognition purposes.
- We could not identify from currently available photos the exact type of underwing bomb racks this aircraft carried, so use whatever type you prefer.

#### Black Chevron Bar

WOW! Six colors on a Dora (at least!). This Dora was likely originally a Fw 190A-8. We believe this because the
fuselage exhibits evidence of several repaintings/overpaintings of markings, while the fuselage plug is either natural
metal, primer, or fresh 75. This characteristic was common on D-9s rebuilt from earlier version aircraft. The underwings could have very well been natural metal instead of the blue-green we've depicted—your choice! For those
'Lufties' who love odd schemes, knock yourself out!

## **Applying the Decals**

You probably already know all this stuff, so feel free to use your regular process; however, if you're new to aftermarket decals, here goes:

- Generally, use the Microscale Finishing System. We don't recommend extremely strong decal solvents such as Solvaset.
- Your model must have a smooth, glossy surface, as decals won't adhere well to matte surfaces. Use gloss paints or your favorite clear gloss overspray over matte or semigloss paint.
- Cut each subject out without trimming off the slight excess film (this helps the decal film disappear when dry).
- Put the decal in warm water that has a drop or two of liquid dishwashing soap or photo-flo for 10 seconds.
- When the decal will slide off the backing paper without forcing it, apply it to the proper position on your model.
   Slide the backing paper out from underneath.
- Gently blot off excess water and smooth out bubbles under the decal surface. If you wish, carefully brush on a mild decal softener such as Micro-Sol.
- When all decals are completely dry, gently wash off all excess decal adhesive.
- Finally, overcoat your model with a good quality gloss coat, followed by your choice of matte or eggshell clear topcoat.
