AIRCRAFT 1 • He-111H-3 of the Slovakian Air Force, Trencin, spring of 1943. Uppersurfaces are RLM 70 Schwartzgrün and RLM 71 Dunkelgrün; undersurfaces RLM 65 Hellblau. Former Luftwaffe markings over painted. Spinners and propellers RLM 70. Note RLM 04 Gelb tips of wing undersurfaces.

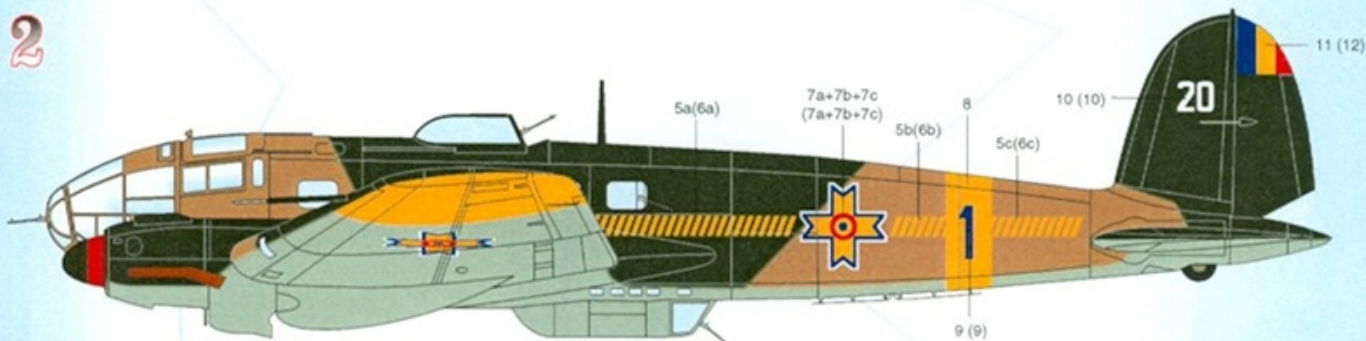
AIRCRAFT 2 • He-111H-3 of the Grupul 5 of Rumanian Corpul 1 Aerian, operating in the Zaporozh'ye area of the Ukraine, early 1943. Uppersurfaces are RLM 70 Schwartzgrün and RLM 79 Sandgelb; undersurfaces RLM 65 Hellblau. Spinners are according to references RLM 70 with RLM 23 Röt stripe. Propellers RLM 70. Note large RLM 04 Gelb panels on outer wing undersurfaces.

Possibility exists that this A/C had splinter sections of RLM 79 over the standard He-111 camouflage pattern of RLM 70/71. Use your discretion.

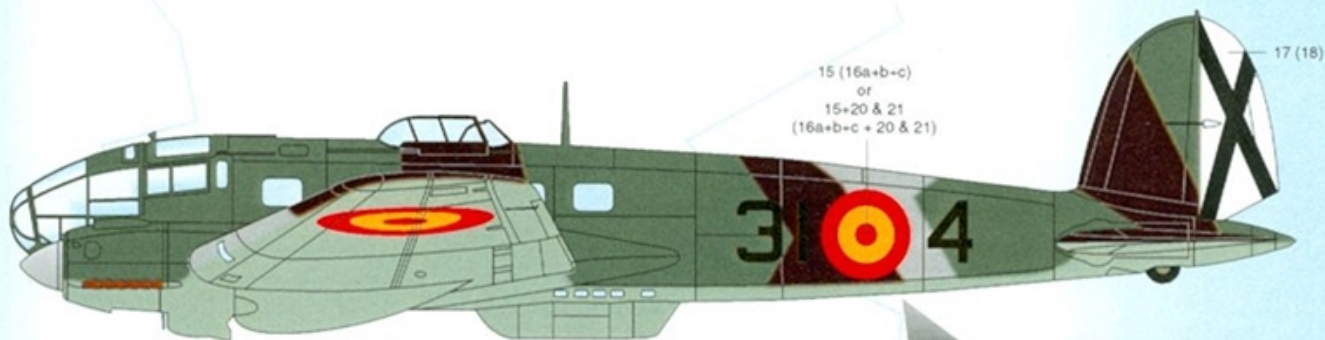
AIRCRAFT 3 • CASA-built He-111H-16, of Ala 31, Spanish Ejercito del Aire, late 1950s. Uppersurfaces painted in a splinter pattern of Dark Green (RLM 62), Medium Gray (RLM 63) and Brown (RLM 61), undersurfaces Light Blue (RLM 65?). Spinners in natural aluminum. Paint rudder White before applying decals #17 and #18.

Note: This A/C may have had a thin White outline to the fuselage codes. These outline are provided to you separately, and are to be applied last. Also, order of the right side codes are unknown, our choice would be 4-31. Decals are separate to give you any option you may want.
