

P-51D-15-NA, 44-14888, "Glamorous Glen III", 363rd FS,357th FG, Leiston, England, 1945. Flown by Capt. Charles Yeager. Natural metal overall with black and white invasion stripes on undersides of wings and fuselage. National insignias greyed out. Note rearview mirror on windscreen frame.
"Short Fuse Sallee" [a P-51B (43-12434) of the 356 FS ( 354 FG) in O.D. \& Neutral Gray with white nose, spinner \& flash] was Maj. Richard Turner's mount in the Spring of 1944. It was the first of four Mustangs the 9th AF ace used. To achieve the sprayed effect around the personal marking, first apply decal 11a and allow to dry thoroughly. Carefully overspray a $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ ring of White around the decal 11a. When dry, add and align decal 11b.
"Arsons Reward", a P-51D (44-13948) of the 353 FS ( 354 FG ) wears overall aluminum with yellow nose, spinner and O.D. anti-glare panel. Depicted as it appeared in 1945, its pilot was Capt. Wallace Emmer, an ace with 14 kills. Kill markings arrengement, fuselage codes presentation, and serial spacing are conjectural.
