Ju 87 G Stukas

Stab SG 2 & 10.SG 2

On 8 May 1945, Oberst Hans-Ulrich Rudel flew his final mission of WW II. Under orders from Carl Donitz, Rudel was to lead the remaining elements of his Geschwader to surrender into the hands of the Western powers. There was an intense desire to surrender to them and not be captured by the Russians, where they likely would have suffered terrible atrocities. The Stukas were to be escorted by four Fw 190s of SG./ 2. Such was the desire to escape the Russians that some of these aircraft, including a Fw 190, carried female passengers.

Now an amputee from an earlier crash, Rudel shook hands with his ground crew and flew westwards. Ground crews were to advance to the west in convoy. Unfortunately, they would fall into Russian hands where they attacked by Czech forces and

subsequently killed.

Upon arrival at Kitzingen, Rudel ordered that no aircraft was to fall into Allied hands intact. Two of the three Stukas jettisoned their landing gear upon arrival and the aircraft slid to a stop. The war was over for this highly decorated Stuka pilot.
