







## Messerschmitt Bf109 "Early Emil" Part 1

- A** Bf109E-3 "White 4", 4/JG 26. Flown by Horst Perez. Shot down by Hurricanes over Beachy Head, and belly-landed in a field in East Dean, Sussex, 30th Sept. 1940. RLM 71/02/65.
- 
- B** Bf109E-3, Stab I/JG 3. Flown by Hans 'Assi' Hahn. Merseburg, Germany, Sept. 1939. RLM 70/71/65. Spinner is RLM70.

- C** Bf109E-3 "White 9", 4/JG 51. Early 1940. RLM 70/71/65 with RLM02 blotches on the upper fuselage and upper wing surfaces.

- D** Bf109E-1 "Yellow 8", 9/JG 2. Flown by Rudolf Rothenfelder. Thieville, France, Aug. 1940. Base color same as "B" scheme, with RLM65 and 02 randomly sprayed on the side. Spinner tip is yellow.

- E** Bf109E-1 "Black 14", 2/JG 52. Flown by Leo Zaunbrecher. Shot down and crash landed in a field in Mays Farm near Lewes, Sussex on 12th Aug. 1940. RLM 71/02/65.

- F** Bf109E-1 "Red 16", 2/JG 26. Flown by Fritz Losigkeit. Werl, Germany, Mar. 1940. RLM 71/02/65.
