

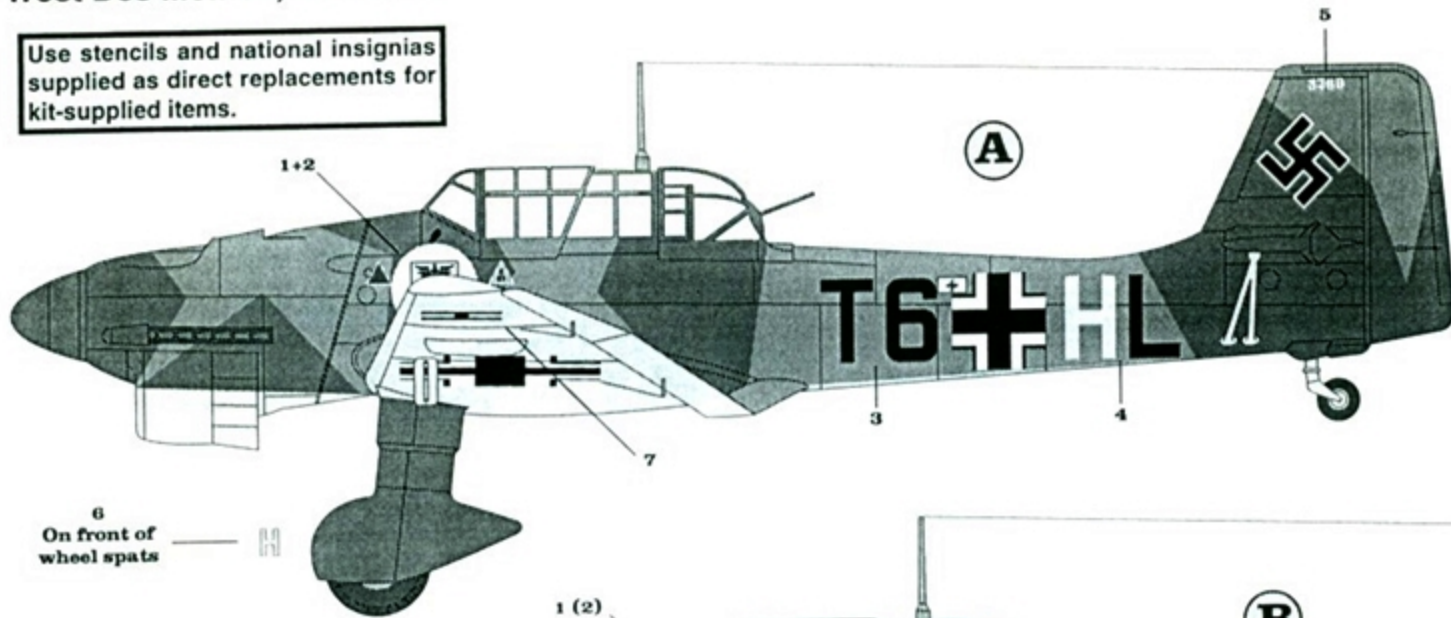

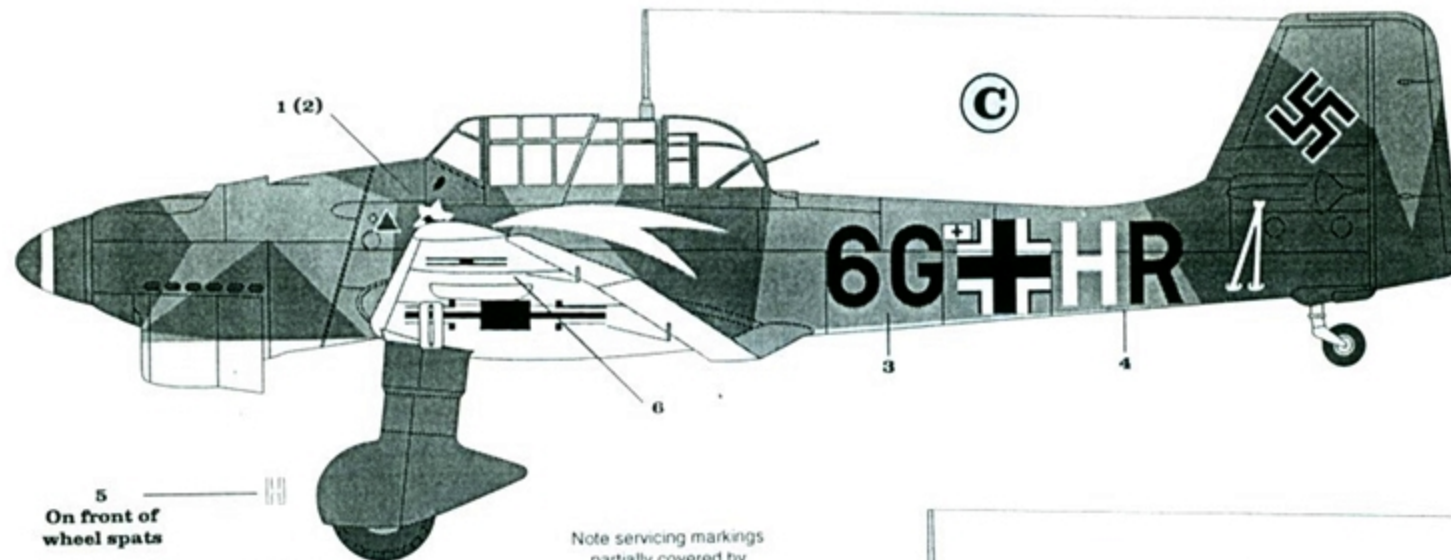
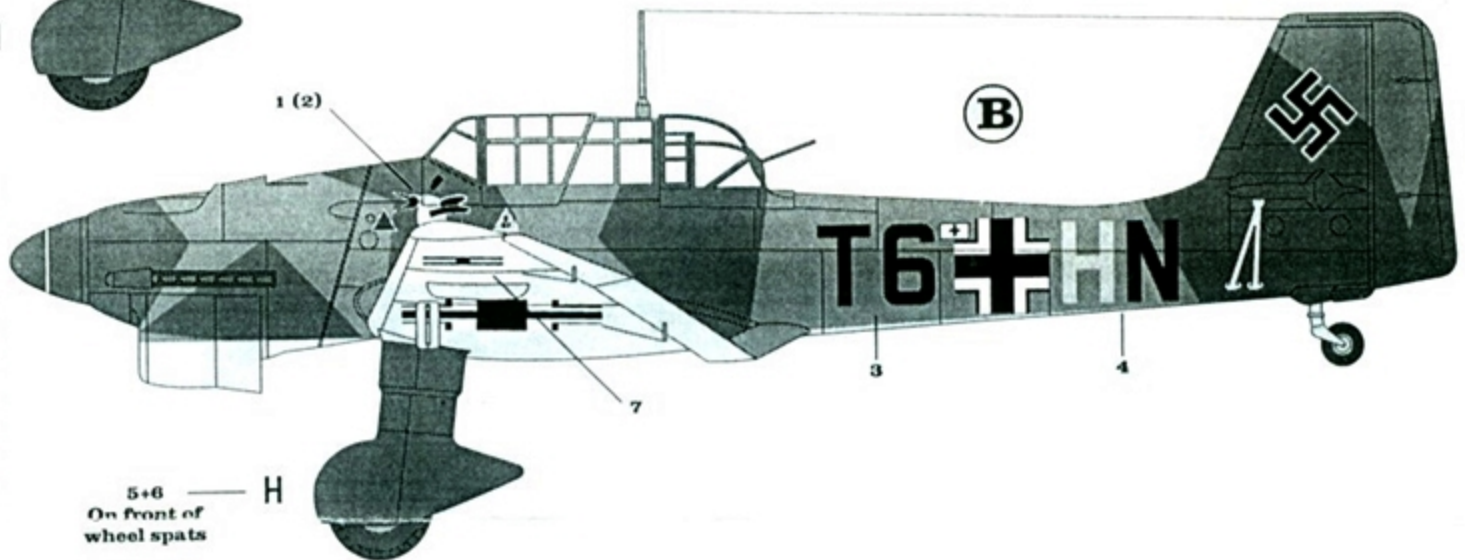

Use stencils and national insignias supplied as direct replacements for kit-supplied items.



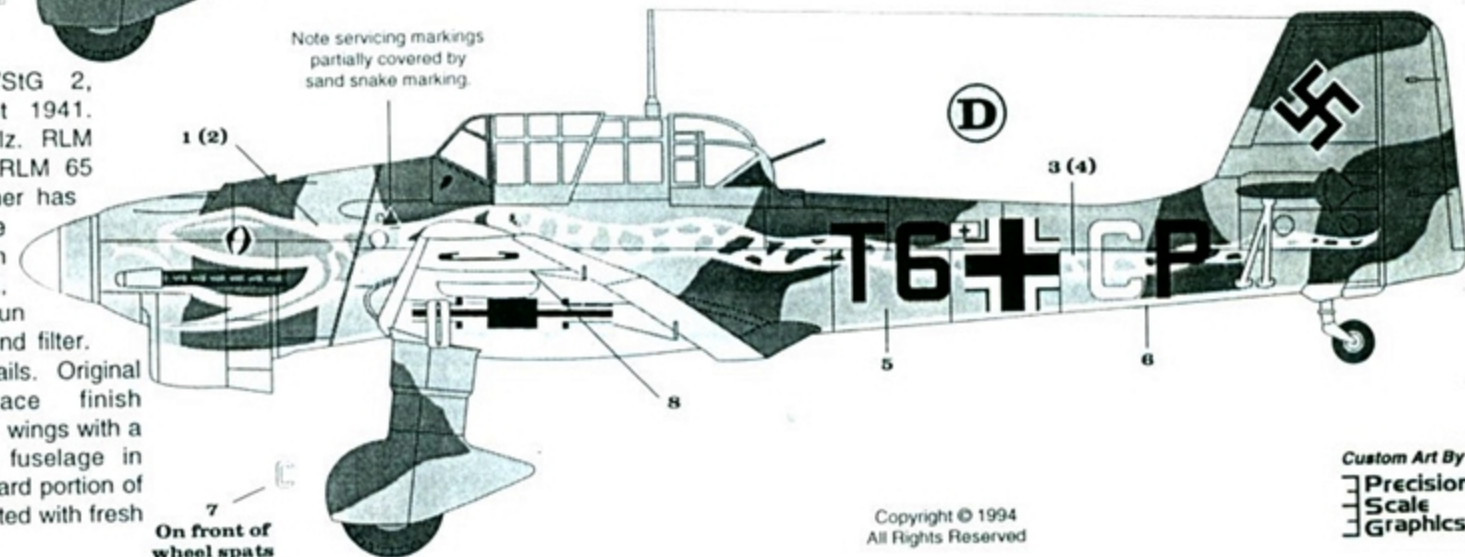
Ju-87B-2, W.Nr. 3360, 3./StG 2. Standard RLM 70/71/65 camouflage. This aircraft was shot down by Hurricanes of 601 Sqdn. near Selsey, Sussex after a raid on Tangmere, 16 August 1940.

Ju-87B-1 of 5./StG 2, France, 1940. Standard RLM 70/71/65 camouflage with thin white band on spinner. Note that although this is a Ju-87B-1, it has the later B-2 style exhaust. It retains the narrow chord propellor blades and solid cowl flaps of the B-1 however. See references for details



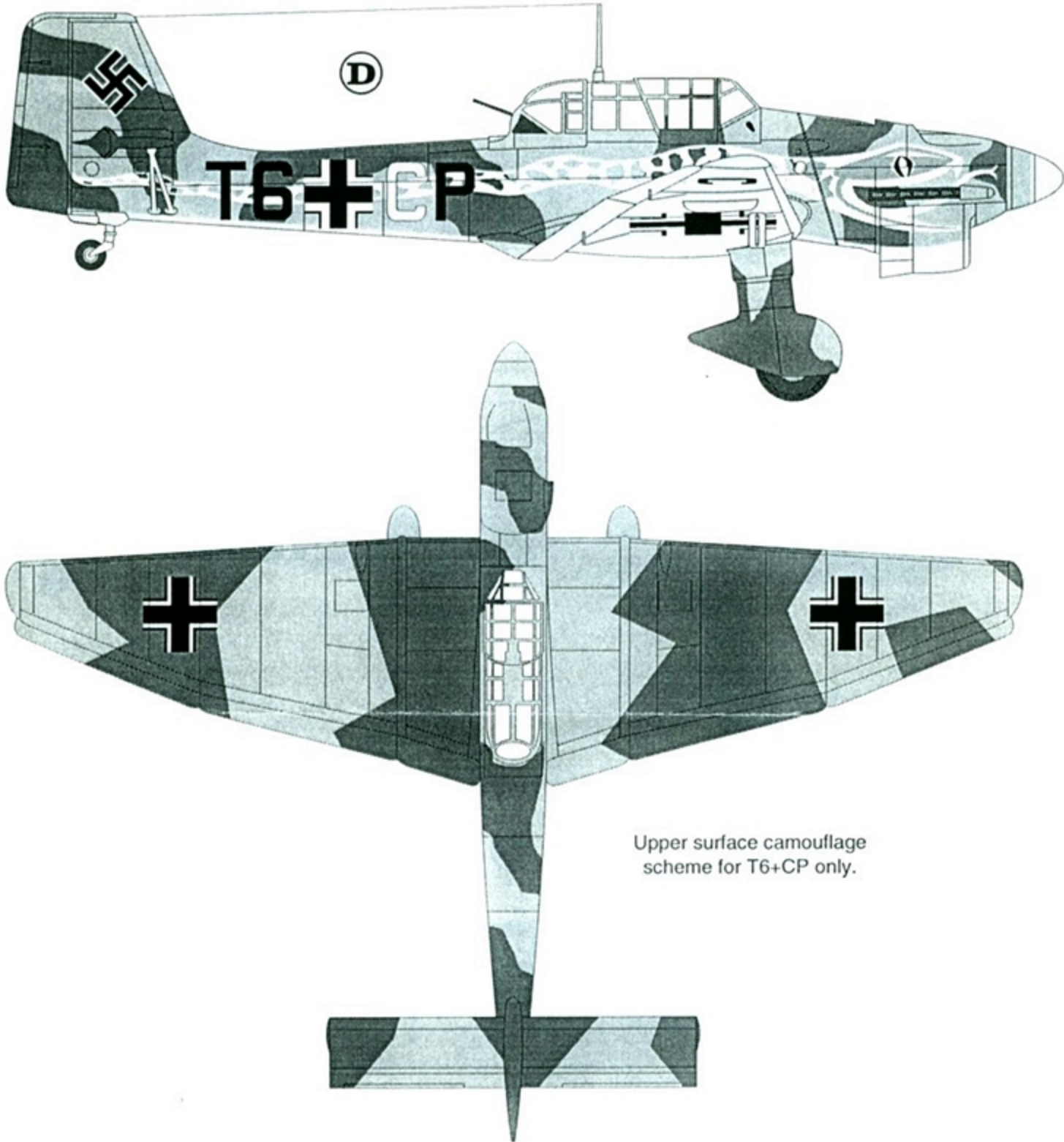
Ju-87B-1 of 4./StG 1, France, August, 1940. Standard RLM 70/71/65 camouflage with white band on spinner. Note modifications required for B-1 variant. See references.

Ju-87R-2/trop of 6./StG 2, Tmimi, Libya, August 1941. Flown by Lt. Hubert Polz. RLM 79/80, probably with RLM 65 lower surfaces. Spinner has yellow tip and white band. Aircraft fitted with Piel G.IV ADF antenna, armored LKK rear gun mount, and tropical sand filter. See references for details. Original 70/71 upper surface finish overpainted with 79/80, wings with a splinter pattern, and fuselage in flowing patterns. Forward portion of sand snake was repainted with fresh Sand Yellow 79.
