Right: A nice in-flight shot of Duchess Arlene. Note the alignment of the aircraft number "10" in relation to the national insignia. Photo taken before Williams had his aircraft decorated with two victory markings as a result of his successful encounter with two Fw 190s on 30 March 1945. Note the last three digits of the aircraft serial has not been applied to the left side. However, other published images do indicate the numbers "648" applied to the right side just above the national insignia.
