

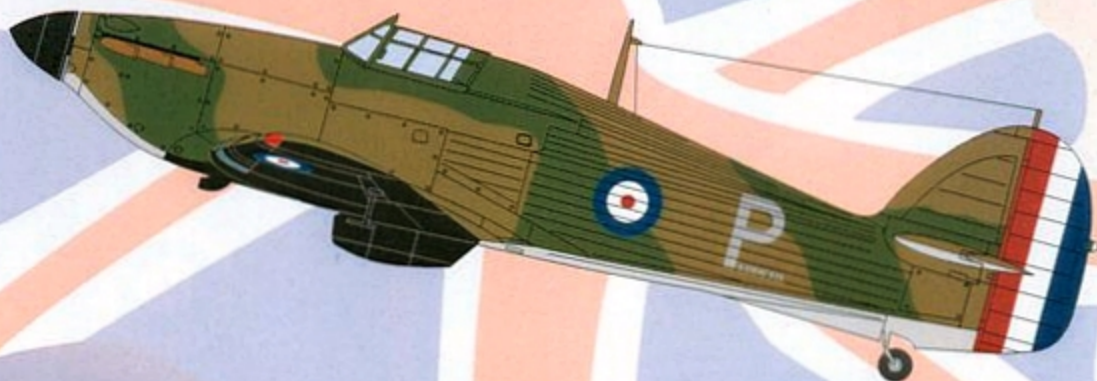

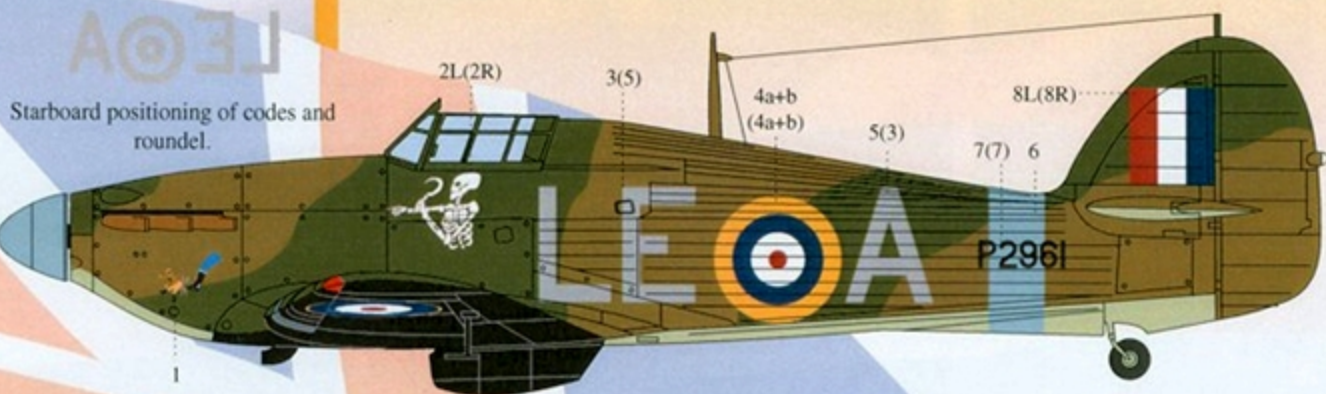

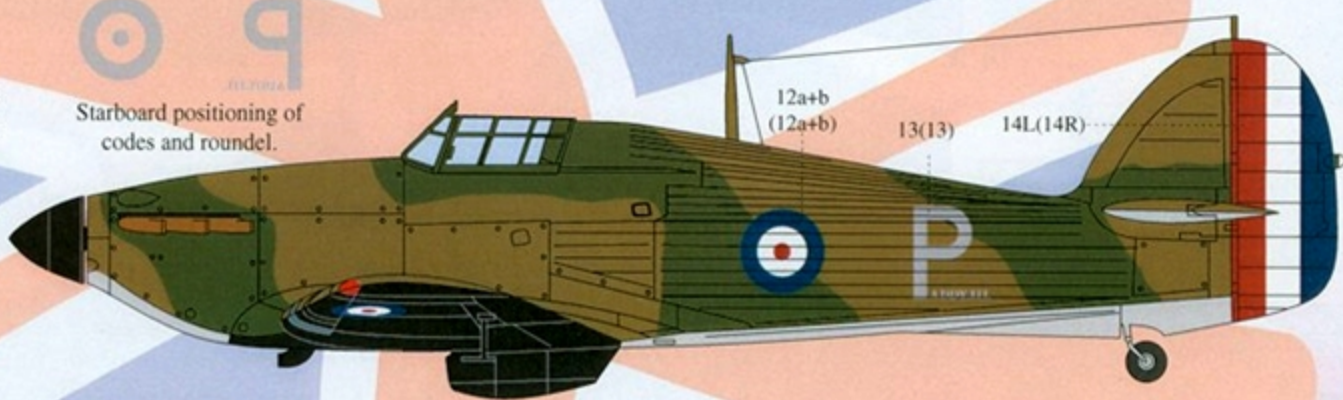

Early Hurricane Aces Pt. 1 of the British Empire 1939-40

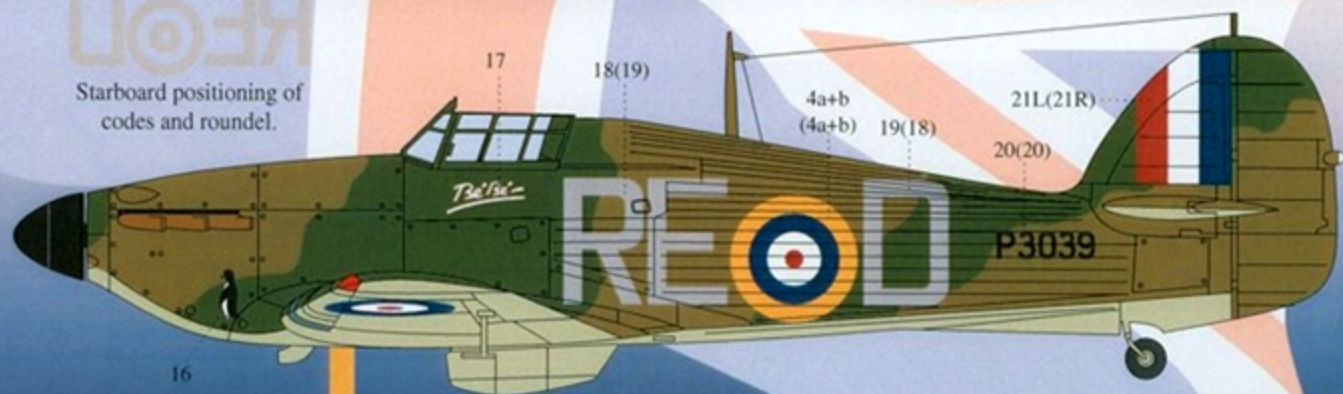
Hurricane Mk.I P2961 LE-A. Flying Officer W.L. 'Willie' McKnight, Canada. 242 Squadron RAF, Coltishall, December 1940. 'Willie' McKnight's Hurricane carries his personal motif of a skeleton brandishing a sickle (relating back to his training in medicine) and the 'unofficial' squadron insignia on the nose. His final victory score stood at 17, virtually all gained while flying Hurricanes. Sky Blue rotol spinner and fuselage band.



Hurricane Mk.I (serial unknown) P 'PADDY' Flying Officer Edgar James 'Cobber' Kain DFC, New Zealand. 73 Squadron RAF, 67 Wing, Advanced Air Striking Force (AAF), Rouvres, France, Spring 1940. 'Cobber' Kain was one of the war's first aces, gaining his early victories during the Battle of France. Kain's final victory score came to 17, all achieved while flying Hurricanes with the AAF. This is a Watts two bladed propeller A/C, with White right bottom wing and Aluminum dope front and rear end as indicated.



Hurricane Mk.I, P3039, "B b", 229 Sqdn, RAF Northolt, September 1940. Flown by P/O V. Ortmans (Belgian). RAF Dark Earth, Dark Green and Sky camouflage with Black spinner. Squadron code forward of roundel on starboard side. Unknown if Ortmans achieved ace status. Rotal spinner.
