



A/C 1

EKA-3B of VAQ133, CVW-11 aboard USS Kittyhawk, October 1970.

Gull Gray over Gloss White with Sloping rear end demarcation line. S/S #148, page 32 claims the fin trim to be Red, but we believe it to be Black. Also notice that the picture in S/S 148 is a KA-3B, not a EKA-3B as we are featuring.

Apply decal 1 & 2 before decal 17 and prior to gluing refueling probe part # K3 and J4.

A/C 2

EKA-3B of VAQ-135, CVW 6, aboard USS Franklin D. Roosevelt during 1971.

Camouflage as per A/C 1, except that front end is Black and fin tip is Maroon (wine) color.

A/C 3


EA-3B of VQ-2, NAS ROTA, Spain June 1981.


Camouflage as A/C #1. Notice the plain refueling probe and electronic pack under the belly. Read note to modeler,

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MODELERS NOTE:

For A/C 3 you must do a little conversion, thoughtfully provided by our friends at Hasegawa. You will need to use the kit# K134, EKA-3B. During construction discard part K3 and replace it with J3 (which shows in gray on their instructions part layout, as not used). Delete part J1 entirely. Manufacture electronic pack (Perhaps extending a Hobby Craft T33 tip tank will be a good beginning). Now you have a EA-3B. That elmplot We believe Hasegawa will be re-boding the same kit in the KA-3B version soon. Until then, Sayonara!
