BEDFORD MK

F.V. 13801 Truck General Service, 4 Tonne, 4 x 4

The Bedford MK series, generally known as the "4 tonner" was introduced in the early 70's to replace the Bedford RL series then in widespread use with the British Army.

The MK series was developed from the Bedford civilian TK 4 x 2 chassis to meet a MOD specification for a general purpose load carrier capable of operating in military environments throughout the world.

The Bedford MK has been produced with a variety of different bodies, this model being based on the F.V. 13801, the basic L.H. drive general cargo truck. The R.H. drive version has the designation F.V. 13802. When fitted with the power take-off winch the designations are F.V. 13803 / F.V. 13804 respectively.

The MK series are true multipurpose vehicles being used as a general cargo / personnel carriers by all three services, as well as in a number of specialist roles including, artillery tractors, light recovery, tippers, reconnaissance drone carriers, bridging trucks and as aircraft refuellers.

They can be fitted with an Atlas crane or as snow ploughs and with the tail-gate and sides removed they take the CB.300 range of container bodies.

Originally the MK series were fitted with Bedford 330-93 6-cylinder multi-fuel engine but from 1981, a more powerful diesel engine has been fitted and the resulting vehicles are known as the MJ series.


