Pilot: Colonel C.E. "Bud" Anderson. The third highest scoring pilot of the unit, Anderson would fly more than one tour, a common feature among many of the leading aces of the unit. Credited with 16.25 victories.

Colors: Overall natural metal. No ID bands on wings or tail surfaces. OD glare panel. Black and White invasion stripes lower surfaces of wings and rear fuselage.

Rudder: Red. Spinner: Red/Yellow/Red stripe.

National Markings: Factory Standard

Pilot: Major John B. England. The second highest scoring pilot with the group, England would fly 108 missions without a break. He would ultimately receive credit for 17.5 aerial victories. John England survived the war and remained in the Air Force but was lost in 1954 in the crash of an F-86 in France.

Colors: Uppersurfaces: Likely RAF Green though OD a possibility.

Undersurfaces: Likely RAF Gray though Neutral Gray a possibility.

Black and White invasion stripes lower fuselage only. No ID bands on wings or tail.

Pilot: Major Leonard "Kit" Carson. One of the original members of the group, he would fly two combat tours. Carson was the highest scoring member of the group with 18.5 confirmed air victories credited during 115 combat missions. Aircraft fitted with fuselage formation lights and AN/APS-13 RWR antenna on vertical tail.

Colors: Overall natural metal. No ID bands on wings or tail surfaces. OD glare panel. Spinner: Red/Yellow/Red stripe.
