"The end of the plain plane", the colorful brochure announced. Here was literally a rainbow of colors decorating their fleet of new jetliners. The fuselage of each plane was painted an eye-catching shade of blue, turquoise, green, lemon, orange or beige. The rest of the plane was white and natural metal. This was the introduction of Braniff International Airlines' new image in 1965.

Most airlines used the same generic scheme on every airplane, but with the arrival of the new Braniff scheme, the airport loading ramps took on the appearance of a painter's pallet. Even the crew and flight attendants received new attire, designed by Pucci.

coordinated shoes! When dinner is served, the hostess is found wearing a serving dress, which is exchanged for a highnecked blouse and culottes in blue following the meal.

Even the ground service crew was provided with Pucci uniforms and the baggage carts, loading ramps and service vehicles wore a coat of the colorful paint.

Braniff began in 1928, when Paul Braniff began three flights a day between Tulsa and Oklahoma City. About a year later, the company was purchased by Universal Aviation. But Braniff knew there was market in supplying rapid service to the men developing new oil fields, so he purchased a pair of Lockheed Vegas and boards the plane wearing a "reversible cold formed Braniff Airways. 


















(5) MAIN LANDING GEAR WELL




6 LEFT MAIN LANDING GEAR





RETRACTED NOSE GEAR




707-300 PARTS LAYOUT DIAGRAM










Revised Braniff Engine Assembly Instructions
