"Red 6" 2./JG 300

Oct.-Nov. 1943 Bonn-Hangelar, Germany

Pilot: Ofw. Arnold Döring. Short antenna mast, DF loop and FuG 25a antenna intact, Underwing 20 mm gun pod. No armored headrest in canopy. Werknummer over painted with Gray.

Colors: Original color scheme was RLM 76 under surfaces, upper surfaces RLM 74/RLM 75 with under surfaces over painted for night Wilde Sau missions in Black, top surfaces very dark Gray with some original RLM 76/RLM 74/RLM 75 showing through. See color profile. Spinner: rear portion Black, front segment RLM 23 Red. Propeller blades: RLM 70 Black-Green.

National Markings: Fusclage; 900 mm White outline crosses mostly obscured by over painting of Dark Gray.

300 mm Hakenkreuz obliterated by over painting of Dark Gray Wings: Upper - over painted 1000 mm White outline crosses but included on decal sheet;

Lower - 900 mm crosses completely over painted with Black

Stencilling: Other than octane triangle and victory bars on rudder, stencilling is over painted.

"Red 8" III./JG 300

July 1944 Jüterbog-Waldlager, Germany

Pilot: Oblt. Kurt Gabler. Short antenna mast, DF loop and FuG 25 a antenna present. This aircraft had most of the camouflage colors removed in order to gain additional speed. Werknummer removed by sanding.

Colors: Under surfaces originally RLM 76 but sanded down to bare metal. Upper surfaces RLM 74/RLM 75 sanded down to bare metal. Spinner: Black with White spiral. Propeller blades: RLM 70 Black-Green. Canopy and wind screen framing RLM 66, Upper and lower wingtips White; Rudder White with wavy lines of Dark Gray, Small access panels including fuel slightly darker aluminum. Gun trough, since they were iron, are darker than the aluminum alloy skin on the fuselage and wings. Dark wide Red JG 300 fuselage band.

National Markings: Fuselage; 900 mm White cross was left but interior Black was polished off;

300 mm Hakenkreuz sanded and scraped until almost completely gone.

Wings: Upper - 1000 mm White outline crosses appear to be completely sanded off but included on decal sheet. Lower - 900 mm crosses included on decal sheet but could have been removed, no photo verification,

Stencilling: Appears to be all removed. Two rows of victory bars on White rudder.

"White 2 Black 18" 1./JG 300 June-July 1944 Herzogenauraach, Germany

Canopy has silica jel pellets and flat G-5 rear canopy panel, but fuselage has fresh air scoop under the wind screen so it could no longer be a pressurized Bf 109 G-5. Pilot: Uffz. Hermann Berdelmann. Werknummer unknown. Tall antenna mast, DF loop, FuG 25 a antenna all present. Tall tail. Previous JG 54 number "Black 18" still in place with a new JG 300 "White 2" added.

Colors: Under surfaces RLM 76; upper surfaces RLM 75/RLM 74 with heavy mottling on fuselage, partially obscuring fuselage Balkenkreuz and Hakenkreuz. This aircraft was previously with JG 54. A large Green Heart emblem under the canopy over sprayed on both sides with RLM 74 Gray, Still displaying JG 54's wide medium Blue fuselage band, Spinner: Black with White spiral, Propeller blades: RLM 70 Black-Green, much of the color on the back of the propeller blades has been worn off.

National Markings: Fuselage; 900 mm Black and White partially over painted crosses 300 mm Hakenkreuz partially over painted Wings: Upper - 1000 mm White outline crosses Lower - 900 mm Black with White outline Crosses

Stencilling: Large amount of stencilling seems to be over painted with mottling.

"Yellow 13" 9,/JG 300

June 1944

Jüterbog-Waldlager, Germany

Pilot: Uffz. Klaus Lambio. Werknummer unknown. Short antenna mast, DF loop, FuG 25 a antenna all present and intact. Tall tail.

Colors: Under surfaces RLM 76; upper surfaces RLM 75/RLM 74. Wide dark Red JG 300 fuselage band. Spinner: White with Black spiral, backing plate Black. Propeller blades: RLM 70 Black Green.

National Markings: Fuselage; 900 mm Black with White outline crosses, 300mm Black Hakenkreuz with White outline.

Wings: Upper - 1000mm White outline crosses Lower - 900mm Black and White with thin Black outline crosses

Stencilling: Factory standard
