





About the 'Phantom Painter'

Don 'Hawkeye' Spering from A.I.R. (Aircraft In Review) has been involved with aviation since his childhood days. With his two brothers, Ken and they amassed over 1300 completed model kits. At one point Don and Jim felt there was not enough variations of after market decals and started the A.I.R. decal business in the mid 60s. With



camera in hand they proceeded to photograph aircraft for possible use in decal form. Don has always had a fascination with the early jets and Air National Guard aircraft. Pursuing a career in aviation photography and specializing in air-to-air has set his photography apart from most aviation photographers. Don's photos appear in publications all over the world.

As the era of the F-4 Phantom began Don soon started his 'Phantom Phanatic'ways. Traveling all over the country to photograph the Phantoms on their home turf and to fly with the unit to capture that 'Phacinating Phantom' in the air.

The next step was to change his efforts of painting models to painting the real aircraft on a one to one scale. Don has painted numerous types of aircraft with special markings but the F-4 Phantom is his favorite.

As the Phantom disappears from service Don has managed to paint a series of Phantoms in special markings (as the enclosed EXPERTS-CHOICE DECAL).
