

B-1B LANCER STENCILS FOR STRATEGIC CAMOUFLAGE SCHEME


Decals for One Aircraft






This decal sheet provides complete stencil markings for the Revell 1:48 scale kit of the Rockwell B-18 Lancer when finished in the early, three-color "Strategic" camouflage scheme. This early camouflage was carried from 1985 until it was replaced with the overall Gunship Gray scheme shortly after Air Combat Command assumed control of SAC's B-1B Lancers in March of 1992. The markings provided include rescue, maintenance, warning, and informational stencilling plus a set of the unique style of national insignia used for this scheme. The final style of in-flight refueling markings are also included. Although a slightly different style appeared on the first few production aircraft, its use was limited and it was replaced with the version included here after a very short time.

Paint Scheme Notes

All B-1B Lancers were delivered in the Strategic scheme of FS36081 Dark Gunship Gray, FS36118 Gunship Gray and FS34086 Green Drab. The Green Drab weathered rapidly into a brown that was seen more often than the fresh green color. Wing sweep fabric areas are a light gray color. Radomes are often slightly darker than FS36081. The windows of the B-1B often appear to be edged in silver or a light gray. I have learned that in fact this is a light gray sealant that is initially painted over, but the paint doesn't bond well and it comes off. Walkway stencil decals are provided but the walkway stripes themselves are not. These are relatively easy to apply by reverse mask painting. Paint the areas where the walkways go FS36118 Gunship Gray. Mask using the proper width graphic tape or the masking material of your choice (1/24th inch for 1:48th scale.) Proceed with painting the rest of your camouflage and when finished remove the walkway masks.
