# British Phantoms - The FGR2 (F-4M) of the RAF in Germany

















### Instructions

This AirDOC decal set allows you to build nearly any RAF F-4 Phantom FGR.2 (F-4M) stationed in Germany for a 20 year period. This set includes enough markings for several different aircraft of No. 2, 14, 17, 19, 31 and 92 Squadron.

#### Decal application:

To apply the decals cut each subject carefully from the backing paper. Do not cut away the excess film. Dip the decal for about 20 seconds into water and wait until it slides easily on the backing paper. Do not pull or push the decals before the adhesive has completely dissolved, otherwise it might be ruined. You may use a setting solution but this is not necessary. After the decal is applied to the model's surface, wait several hours until it has set and dried properly. <u>Do Not Touch It Prior!!</u> Depending on the surface's quality, a gloss varnish should be sprayed onto the model prior to the application of the decals, thus, the clear excess film will disappear completely.

1. 1/72 scale modelers try to obtain the very good Fujimi FGR.2 kit number H-6, 7, 8, 9 and others. 2. 1/48 scale modelers use the Hasegawa FGR.2 kit PT 16 or the Revell FGR.2 kit no. 04588 (a reissue of Hasegawa's PT 16 kit at a much lower price).
