Note: Miss Barbara Ann was released in the Monogram kit as is, without Evil Eye Fleagle. There is a outside chance that these are 2 different aircraft as there was a 47-547 and a 49-547. 47*547 is listed as being sent to Alaska, though & as all of the other F-80's I could find within this squadron were dash 10 aircraft, I believe they are one and the same & probably flew with names on both sides of the fuselage. So I am submitting this aircraft as 49°547 with Miss Barbara Ann on the right side and Evil Eye Fleagle on the left. This A/C could be shown with or without lower Red Nose Cap. Both versions possible. Due to the complex curvature of FT-774's intake area, it is suggested that the Red 'shark mouth' intake section would be best painted by the modeller. Therefore, only the teeth Front sections are included on the decal sheet.


