


AeroMarter Decals

Extra Red U.S. AIR FORCE decals are provided to help increase the opacity of the fin legend. Apply them after parts 10,11,40 & 41 are dry, if deemed necessary.


AIRCRAFT 1 . "Ladies Wild / Buzzy McGoo II", F-84G #51-1306. Aircraft piloted by Major Ted McLean, 7th Fighter Bomber Squadron, 49th Fighter Bomber Group, Taegu, 1952. Overall natural metal with Olive Drab anti-glare panel. Gray fin cap with Black leading edge.

AIRCRAFT 2 . "New Orleans Kid", F-84G #51-1077, Aircraft piloted by Major T. P. Ingrassia, 111th Fighter Bomber Squadron, Taegu, 1951. Overall natural metal with Olive Drab anti-glare panel. Gray fin cap with Black leading edge.


AIRCRAFT 3 . "Dolph's Devil", F-84E #50-1191. Aircraft piloted by Lt. Dolph Overton III, 8th Fighter Bomber Squadron, 49th Fighter Bomber Group,1951. Overall natural metal with Olive Drab anti-glare panel. Gray fin cap with Black leading edge.

MODELERS NOTES:

The F84 Thunderjet was the first truly jet fighter bomber of the USAF. Used extensively in Korea during the "Police Action," it sported some of the gaudiest paint jobs in that war. Also, its counterparts in the USAF. Europe (a future AcroMaster release), had beautiful decorations as well. Fore and aft Olive Drab anti-glare panels were the standard (of course futes are finally to be broken) with Zine Chromate wheel wells and polished Natural metal L.G. Struts. Later models had fuel dumps on both sides of the rear fuselage below the horizontal stabilizers. Sometimes these were painted Red. Tail chevrons varied slightly from A/C to A/C and most of the times the stroke of the bars was thinner on the top than on the lower section. We have provided you with a spare decal block to help you patch any blemishes that may happen during application. When applying wing tip tank arrows of stripe decals encompassing the outer winglet, notice that you will have to slice the small sin for the winglet to push through. If you fail to do this, it will not fit. Do it before wetting the decals. Notice that Tamiya's lower wing USAF break down is incorrect. Every picture of F84E-F-G we have seen, shows it broken as on the top right corner of this instruction sheet. See reference 3, pages 11,12,13 & 19.

Needless to say, this decal has been made with the thinnest possible film, and we urge you to handle them with care. They are fragile! Now all that is left is to wish you good luck and happy modeling.
