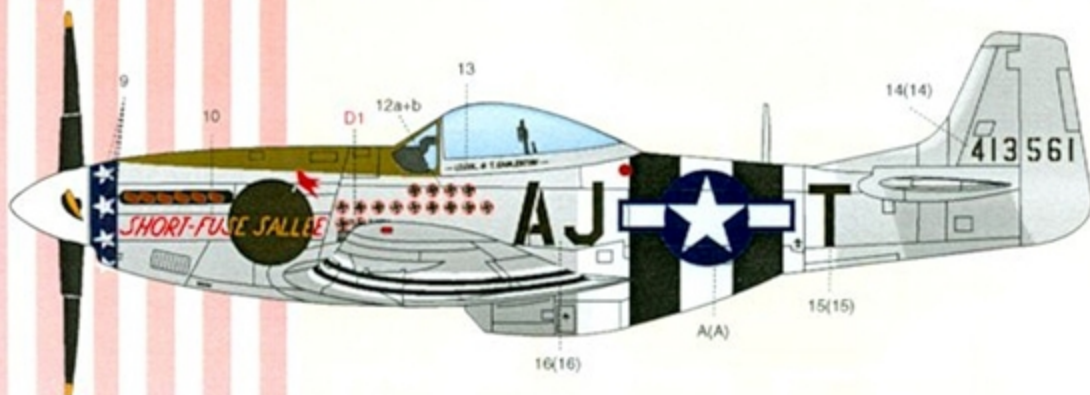
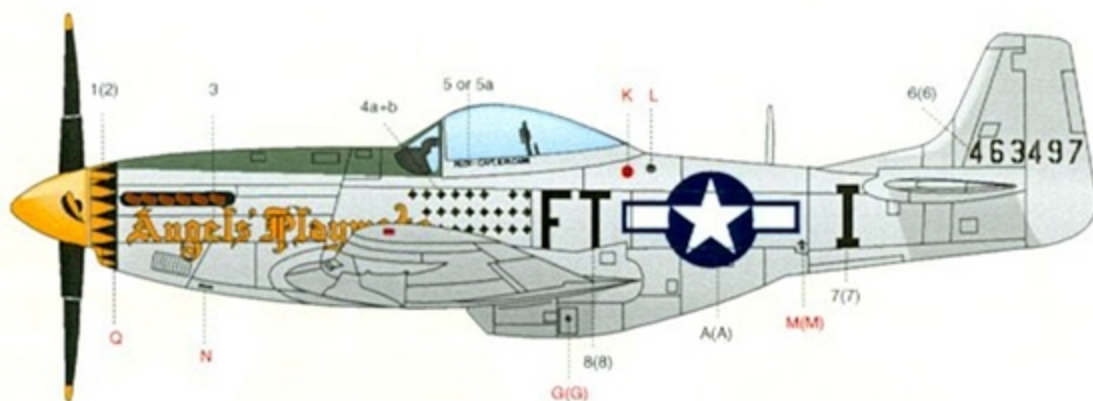

Suggested Kit: Tamiya P-51 Family



Note: Nose pieces measured for Tamiya's Mustang Family.

"Angels' Playmate", a P-51D (44-63497) of the 353 FS (354 FG) wears overall aluminum with black & yellow nose flash and yellow spinner. Depicted as it appeared in May 1945, its pilot was Capt. Bruce Carr. Note that the cowl front was, at an earlier date, painted all-yellow.

"Short Fuse Sallee", a P-51D (44-13561) of the 356 FS (354 FG) wears overall aluminum with white nose spinner and O.D. anti-glare panel. Depicted as it appeared in June 1944, its pilot was Maj. Richard Turner with 16 kills. Note the full "D-Day" black & white invasion striping. Modeller must paint blue nose, then apply star decals.

P-51D, 44-14426 "SCAT 5", January through February 1945. Standard Aluminum finish with Red ruder. Kill markings may have been duplicated on stbd. side so an extra set is provided. European Theater stripes may have been applied, with a thin White stripe along each side (decals 35).

P-51D, 44-72922 "SCAT VII", March 1945 to end of war. Standard Aluminum finish with Red ruder. Kill markings may have been duplicated on stbd. side so an extra set is provided.
