

Turkish Huns F-100 C/D/F in TUAF Services (72023)

Starting in 1958 the TuAF started receiving F-100s within the MAP program. The first arrivasls were the F-100D and the F-100F models supplied from the USAF inventory. A total of 163 were received. This quantity include very few examples from the Royal Danish Air Force. This turnover was followed by the F-100Cs starting in 1972, 115 of which were despatched to the TuAF. They were deployed at at least five air bases. They were extensively used during the Cyprus "Peace Keeping Operation". The last F-100 retires in 1988.

The profile artwork of the F-100D (55-2751) sent to Turkey in 1981.


Unfortunately this aircraft was lost in Diyarbakır four years later.
