

AERO MASTER DECALS



Bf-109G-2, MT-213, 2/HLeLv 24. Flown by Pilot Officer Rero Rithballio, Sunlajarvi, Finland, Hay 1944. Black, clive green (F.S. 34096), and light blue (F.S. 35414) soft edged camouflage. Eastern front theatre bands on nose, tail and lower wingtips in Finnish yellow (F.S. 13655). Rithikallio scored 16 1/2 victories between November 1942 and July 1944. Note use of light blue national insignias.

Bf-109G-2, MT-222, 1/LeLv 34. Flown by Warrant Officer Ilmari Juutilaninen, Suulajarvi, Finland, August 1943. Upper surfaces thinly oversprayed in RLM 74, lower surfaces in RLM 76. Yellow theatre markings, white and RLM 70 spinner. Juutilanainen was Finland's highest scoring ace with 94 1/s victories. NOTE: This aircraft was a rebuilt machine with G-6 type upper wing bulges.


Bf-109G-2, MT-220, 2/LeLv 34. Flown by Warrant Officer Oiva Tuominen, Utti, Finland, June 1943. Standard German 74/75/76 camouflage. German national markings and radio callsign letters oversprayed with color 74. Spinner white and RLM 70. Yellow theatre markings. Tuominen ended the war with a total of 44 victories.




BW-38 **5**

Brewster Buffalo, BW-381, 2/LeLv 24. Flown by Rnsign Vaino Pokela, Tiiksjarvi, Finland, summer 1942. Standard black, green and light blue camouflage with black spinner. Pokela's total score was 5 aircraft. Use large diameter lower wing national insignias.

Brewster Buffalo, BW-393, 3/LeLv 24. Flown by Pilot Officer Hans "Hasse" Wind, Suulajarvi, Finland, September 1943. Black, olive green and light blue camouflage. Yellow theater markings with spinner and tail number in orange. Serial numbers are designed to follow camouflage scheme, changing from black to green to match the local color. Wind achieved a total of 75 kills.





Moraine-Saulnier MS406, MS-622, 2/TLeLv 14. Flown by Flight Lieutenant Harti "Massa" Kalima, Tiiksjarvi, Finland, June 1944. Standard black, green and light blue camouflage with red spinner.

Moraine-Saulnier MS406, MS-619, 1/LeLv 28. Flown by Flight Sergeant Antti Tani, Solomanni, Finland, February 1943. Standard camouflage with white spinner. Tani's final score was 21 1/2.
