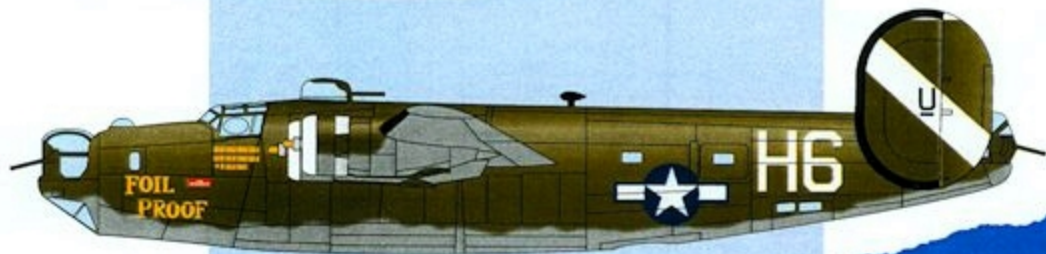

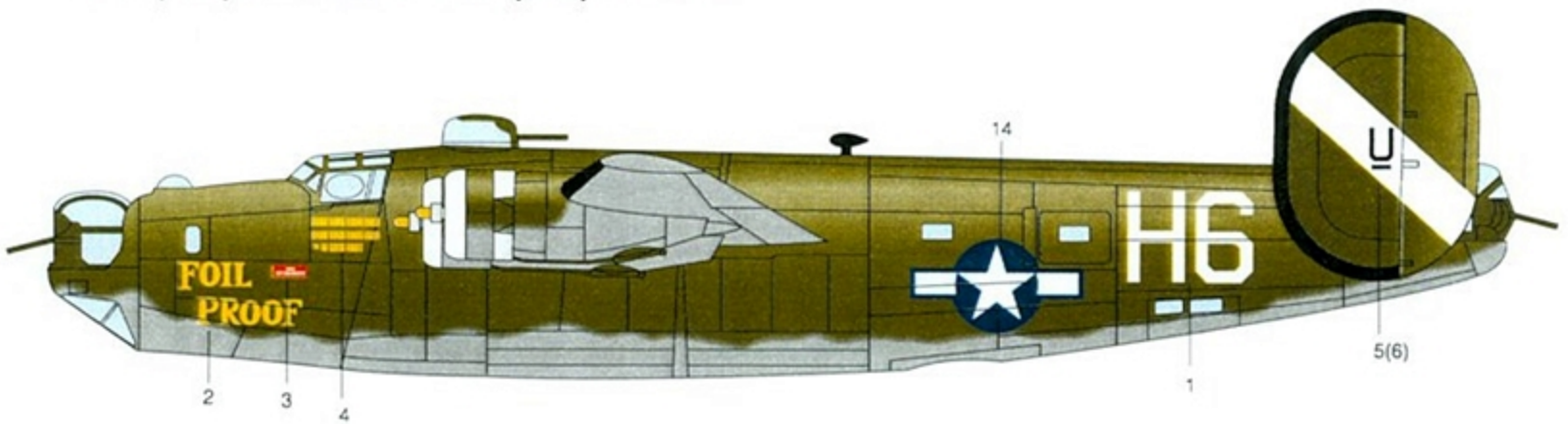


*B-24 Liberators Over Europe Pt. 1*

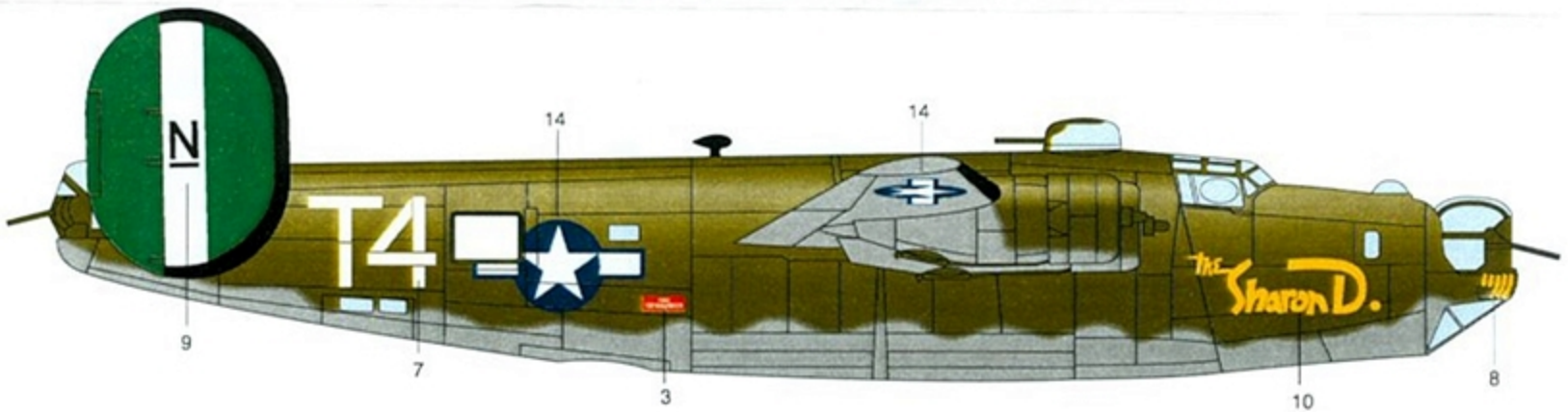

B-24 H-20-FO 42-94805 "FOIL PROOF" 453rd Bomb Group, Old Buckingham. This Liberator survived the war having flown at least 111 combat missions. This aircraft is painted Olive Drab on the upper surfaces and Gray on the lower surfaces. The spinners are painted Yellow, and the cowl rings are White. We were unable to tell whether the cowl flaps were White or natural metal.

B-24 H-15-FO 42-94759 "THE SHARON D" 489th Bomb Group, Halesworth. This aircraft was named after Lt. Col. Leon Vance's daughter, Sharon. He was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor. This Liberator later served with the 445th BG and went on to survive the war. Standard camouflage colors and pattern, with a Green and White tails.



B-24 J-140-CO 42-110162 "PARSONS CHARIOT" 466th Bomb Group, Attlebridge. Formerly of the 491st BG, this aircraft was destroyed after catching fire upon landing after a mission to Brunswick on 31 March 1945. This Liberator had Olive Drab and Neutral Gray camouflage, with Yellow cowl rings and spinners. The cowl flaps were probably natural metal. Red and White tails.
