

Fw190A-2 White 8, Anni flown by Oberleutnant Kurt Goltzsch of 7/JG2. Based at Théville, France, in May, 1942. Mid-war Luftwaffe fighter camouflage of RLM74 Gray-Green and RLM75 Gray-Violet upper surfaces with undersides in RLM76 Light Blue. RLM75 mottling on fuselage and tail. The lower cowl and rudder were RLM04 Yellow. Black Green RLM70 prop and spinner. Standard early style black and white crosses at all wing and fuselage positions; thin black outline on the swastika. 7/JG2 emblem on both sides of cowl. Thirteen victory stripes carried on both sides of the rudder. Werk Nummer 333 on fin.

Fw190A-4 White 4 of 1/JG1, based at Deelen, Holland, during 1943. RLM74/75 upper surfaces with RLM76 undersides and heavy RLM74/75 mottling. RLM04 Yellow lower cowl section. RLM70 Black Green prop with white spinner. All national markings outlined in black. Cowl painted in black and white checks, used by 1/JG1. Staffel emblem carried both sides of cowl. Black antifouling paint behind exhausts. See "Decaling the checkered cowling" note on other page.

Fw190A-4 flown by the Stab of JG54 in Russia, February, 1943. Temporary snow camouflage of washable white applied over the standard factory finish with traces of the original paint showing through and moderate exhaust staining. RLM76 undersides with RLM04 sections on rudder and lower cowl. Black Green prop with white spinner. Standard early black and white crosses at all wing and fuselage positions; swastika with white outline only.

Fw190A-4 White 10 flown by Oberleutnant Walter Nowotny, Staffelkapitān of 1./JG54. Based in Russia, early in 1943. Snow camouflage of White distemper applied over unknown Dark Green, possibly RLM71 or RLM83 on upper surfaces with RLM76 undersides. RLM70 or Black Green spinner and prop with white segment. RLM04 lower rudder and cowl. Crosses had black outlines at all positions, Swastika also outlined in black. I./JG54 gruppe emblem carried on both sides of the cowl, JG54 Green Hearts under the canopy, both sides.

Fw190A-2 Red 7 of 5./JG1 based in Holland, Spring, 1942. Luftwaffe mid-war fighter scheme of RLM74/75 over RLM76 with moderate RLM74/75 mottling on the fuselage sides and tail. RLM70 prop and spinner. Yellow RLM04 lower cowl. Early-style outlined crosses at all positions; swastika also outlined in black.
