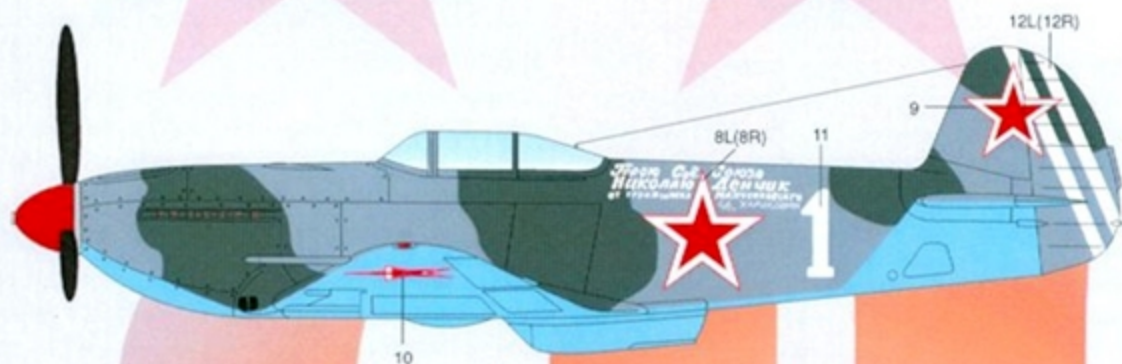
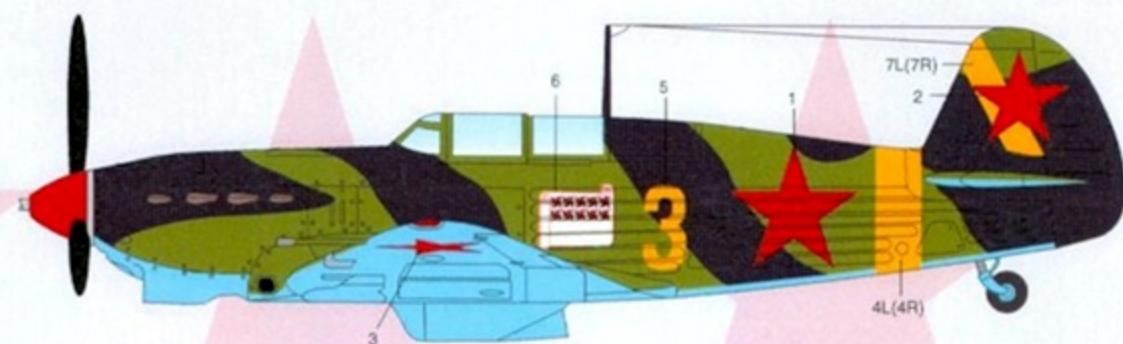

### Yak-7B 'Yellow 3'

Capt. Viktor Yakovlevich Khasin  
Deputy Commander 1 AE, 271 IAP, 274  
IAD, Kalinin Front, late 1942-43.

'Yellow 3' carried an unusual air victories  
scroll below the cockpit. Khasin was  
awarded the Hero of the Soviet Union and  
eventually claimed 28 individual and 5  
group air victories.



### Yak-3 'White 1'

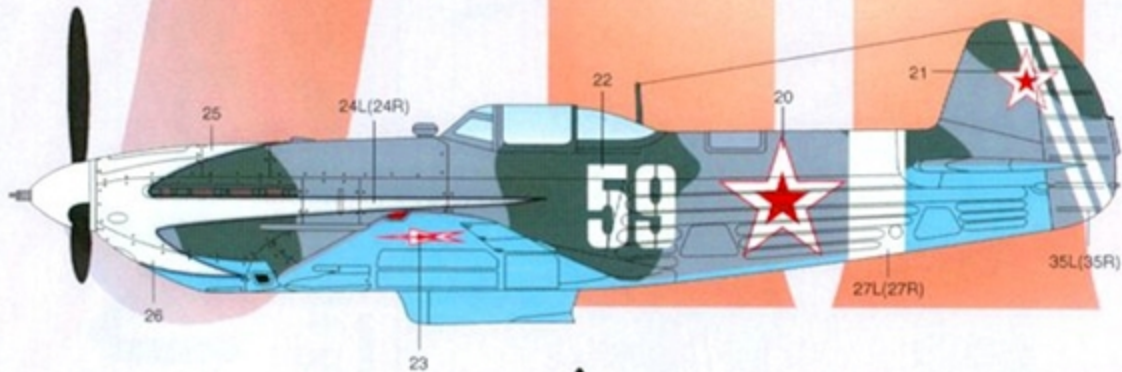
Major Nikolai Fedorovich Denchik  
1 AE Commander, Guards Red Banner  
"Orshanskii", Order of Aleksandr Nevskii  
IAP, 4 GIAD, 1st. Baltic Front, winter 1944.

'White 1' carried a donation inscription from  
the Manchenvkovskii Rural Soviet of  
Kharkov Region. Denchik was awarded the  
Hero of the Soviet Union in April 1944 and  
claimed 19 individual and 3 group air  
victories.

### Yak-7B 'White 45'

Major Aleksandr Nikolaevich Kilaberidze  
1 AE Squadron Commander, 65 Guards Red  
Banner "Orshanskii", Order of Suvorov  
IIIrd Degree IAP, 4 GIAD, 1st. Baltic Front,  
October 1944.

The fierce dog-like monster artwork was  
painted by Motor Mechanic Sgt. V  
Safronov. The inscription read "For Brother  
Shota" and within the arrow, "To the West".  
Note also the small picture of his brother  
just forward of the cockpit.



### Yak-9P 'White 59'

pilot unknown  
4 AE, 66 Guards Red Banner "Vilenskii"  
Order of Suvorov IIIrd. Degree IAP, 4  
GIAD, Perleberg Aerodrome, Germany  
1946.

With the occupation of Germany, the VVS  
permitted more flamboyant markings on  
their aircraft. The white fuselage band was  
carried during a training exercise in 1946.

### Yak-9 'White 3'

Snr. Lt. Nikolai Fedorovich Denchik  
Deputy Commander 1AE, 64 Guards Red  
Banner "Orshanskii", Order of Aleksandr  
Nevskii IAP, 4 GIAD, 2nd. Baltic Front,  
December 1943.

The inscription appears on both sides of the  
fuselage and reads, "For the Motherland". 'White 3' was built at  
Novosibirsk Factory No.153 and was armed  
with one 20mm MP-20 cannon and two  
12.7mm UBS guns.
