FW 190 A-8 WK # 172732 of 5/II/JG300. Flown by Unteroffizer Ernst Schröeder, "Kolle Olleg" was a German carnival slogan and badge. The right side name, Edelgard, was seen in at least 2 styles (both provided). A/C had no canopy pulleys (on top) nor antenna. Standard RLM 74/75/76 camouflage. Notice heavy patch of RLM 75 possibly covering earlier A/C number.

IW 190 A-7; flown by Oberst, Wilhelm Krebs. This aircraft belonged to Stab 1. /JG1, and was based at Dortmund. Germany, 1944. A very colorful A/C, this machine was camouflaged in RLM 74/75/76 colors, with Yellow lower cowling, Red fuselage band, a striped Black and White cowling, and a RLM 70 spinner. Krebs survived the war with 3 victories to his credit. The upper deck gun had a blast tube installed. A very colorful airplane.

FW190 A-8 of 8. / JG300. Based at Finsterwalde, Germany, late 1944. This aircraft, flown by Leutnant Viktor Heimann wears the RLM colors 75/83/76 with a Yellow lower cowling, Black front cowling ring, Blue/White/Blue fuselage defense band and a Black/White spiraled spinner. A word of caution: this A/C has been previously depicted in RLM 81/83 colors. However, analyzing the photos we have, we believe it to be RLM 75/83, and as such we have depicted it on our instruction sheet. Should you decide it was camouflaged in 81/83; nothing is lost, just paint it in the other colors!!! Happy Modelling.
