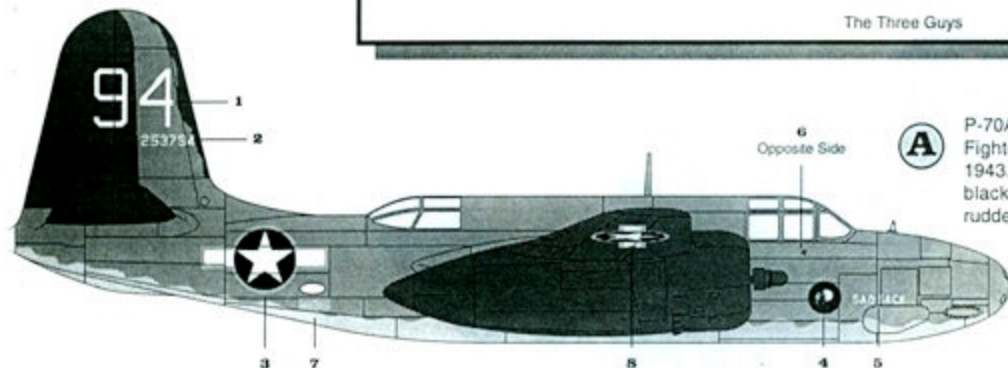

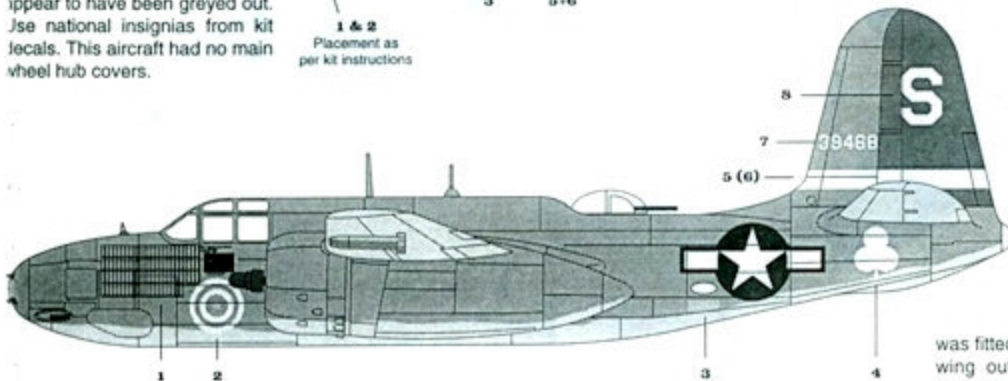
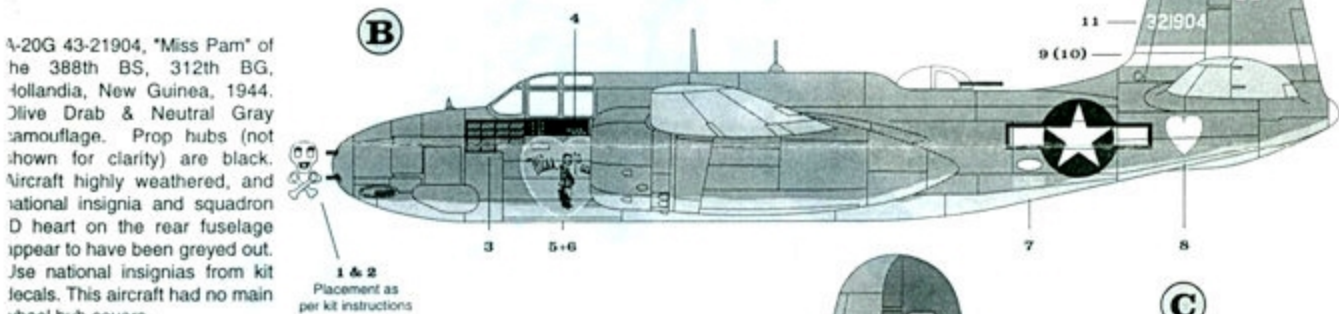

A P-70A-2 42-53794, "Sad Sack", 348th Night Fighter Squadron, Orlando AAF, Florida, 1943. Olive Drab and Neutral Gray with gloss black lower wing & tailplanes, nacelles, rudder, and fin leading edge. Note: This is a conversion from an early A-20G. Use the fuselage parts from the AMT/Ertl A-20B/C kit (available late 1994 or early 1995). All armament removed.

A-20G 43-21904, "Miss Pam" of the 388th BS, 312th BG, Hollandia, New Guinea, 1944. Olive Drab & Neutral Gray camouflage. Prop hubs (not shown for clarity) are black. Aircraft highly weathered, and national insignia and squadron D heart on the rear fuselage appear to have been greyed out. Use national insignias from kit decals. This aircraft had no main wheel hub covers.

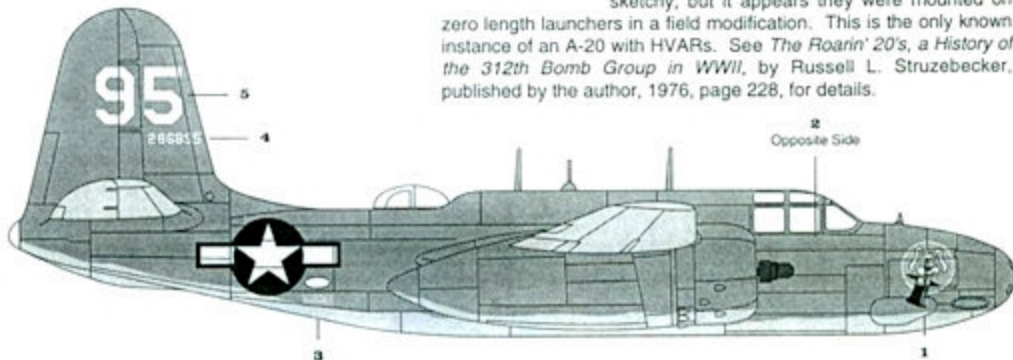


A-20G 43-9468, "Old S" of the 386th BS, 312th BG, Floridablanca Airfield, Philippines, early 1945. Flown by Col. R.H. Strauss, 312th BG Commander. Olive Drab & Neutral Gray camouflage. Rudder appears to be either freshly painted OD or Medium Green. Aircraft highly weathered. Use national insignias from kit decals. Note: this aircraft

was fitted with four 5" HVAR rockets under each wing outboard of the prop arc. Details are sketchy, but it appears they were mounted on

zero length launchers in a field modification. This is the only known instance of an A-20 with HVARs. See *The Roarin' 20's, a History of the 312th Bomb Group in WWII*, by Russell L. Struzebecker, published by the author, 1976, page 228, for details.

D P-70A-2 42-86895, 348th Night Fighter Squadron, Hammer Field, California, 1944. Olive Drab & Neutral Gray camouflage. Note extra antenna mast. Armament removed. Use national insignias from kit decals.
