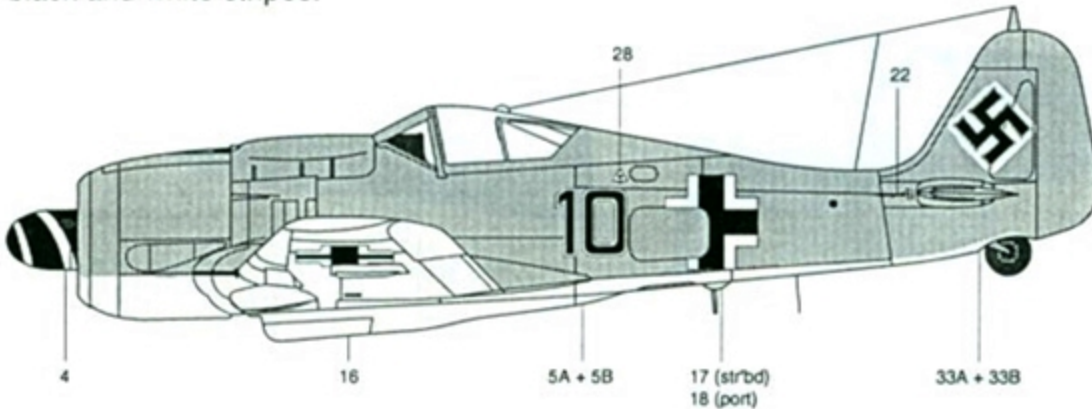
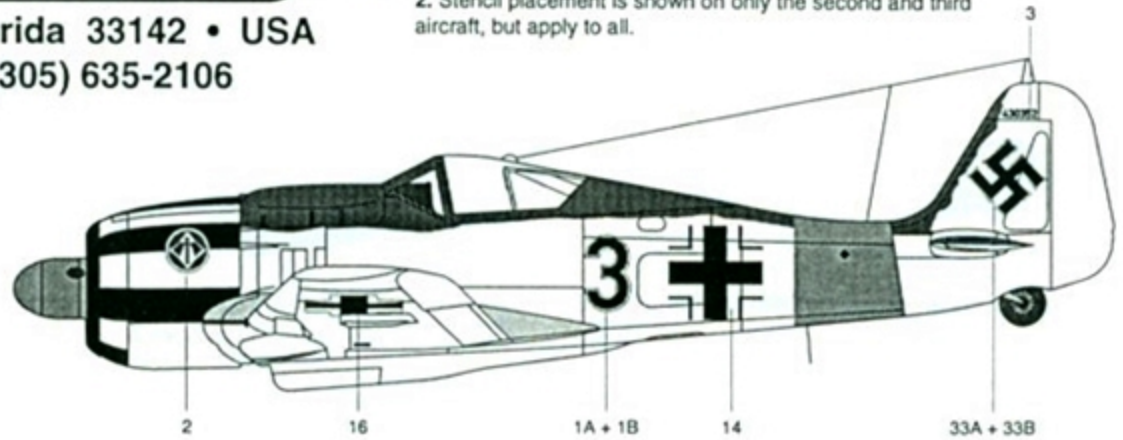

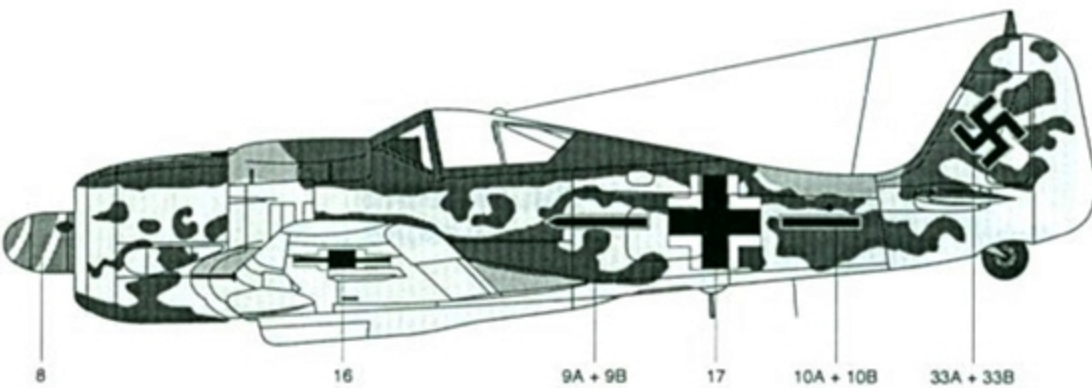
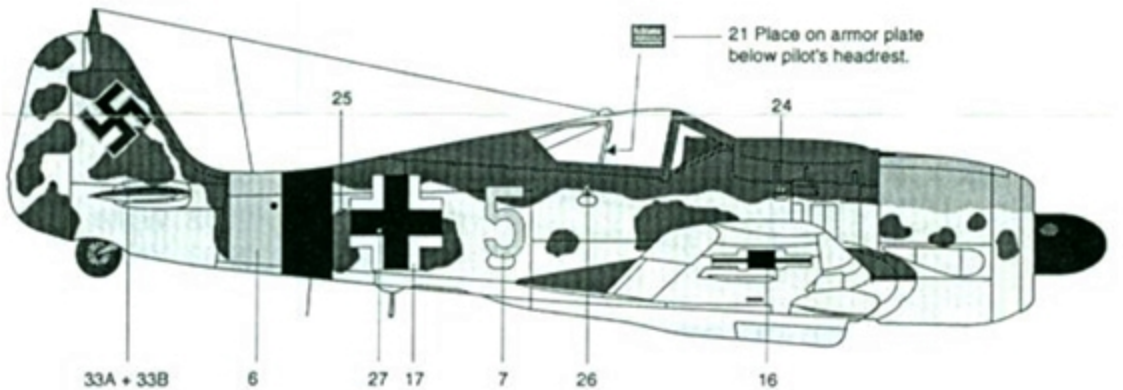
Note: 1. Decal spirals may need to be trimmed slightly to improve fit.  
2. Stencil placement is shown on only the second and third aircraft, but apply to all.

Fw190A-7, W. Nr. 430352, 2./JG1, Dortmund, Germany, early 1944. RLM 74/75/76 camouflage with red propeller spinner and rear fuselage band. Forward cowl ring is black with the remaining cowling alternating horizontal black and white stripes.



Fw190A-8, unit unknown, Kastrup, Denmark, 1945. Camouflage appears to be a spray of Light Green 83 over 76 undersurfaces. Propeller spinner black with white spiral. The radio compartment hatch is a replacement which lacks the Balkenkreuz.

Fw190A-8, 3./JG5, France, summer 1944. RLM 74/75/76 camouflage. Black propeller spinner. Rear fuselage stripes are black and yellow. Heavy RLM 74 overspray almost obscures the underlying color. Note the 74 splotches on the cowling side.



Fw190A-8, W. Gr. 21 Geschwader Stab./JG26, Germany, summer 1945. RLM 74/75/76 camouflage. Green (RLM 25?) propeller spinner with white spiral. Note the 74 shows heavy overspray along the fuselage sides from in front of the cockpit back to and including the vertical fin.

Fw190A-5, 1./JG51 "Molders", Russia, summer 1943. Camouflage appears to be field application of 70/71/83 over 76 undersurfaces. Lower cowling, bottom of rudder, lower wingtips and fuselage band are yellow. Black spinner with white spiral.
