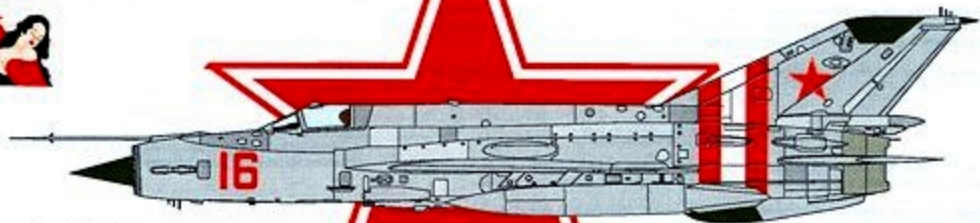

*MiG-21's : Cold War Fishbeds*

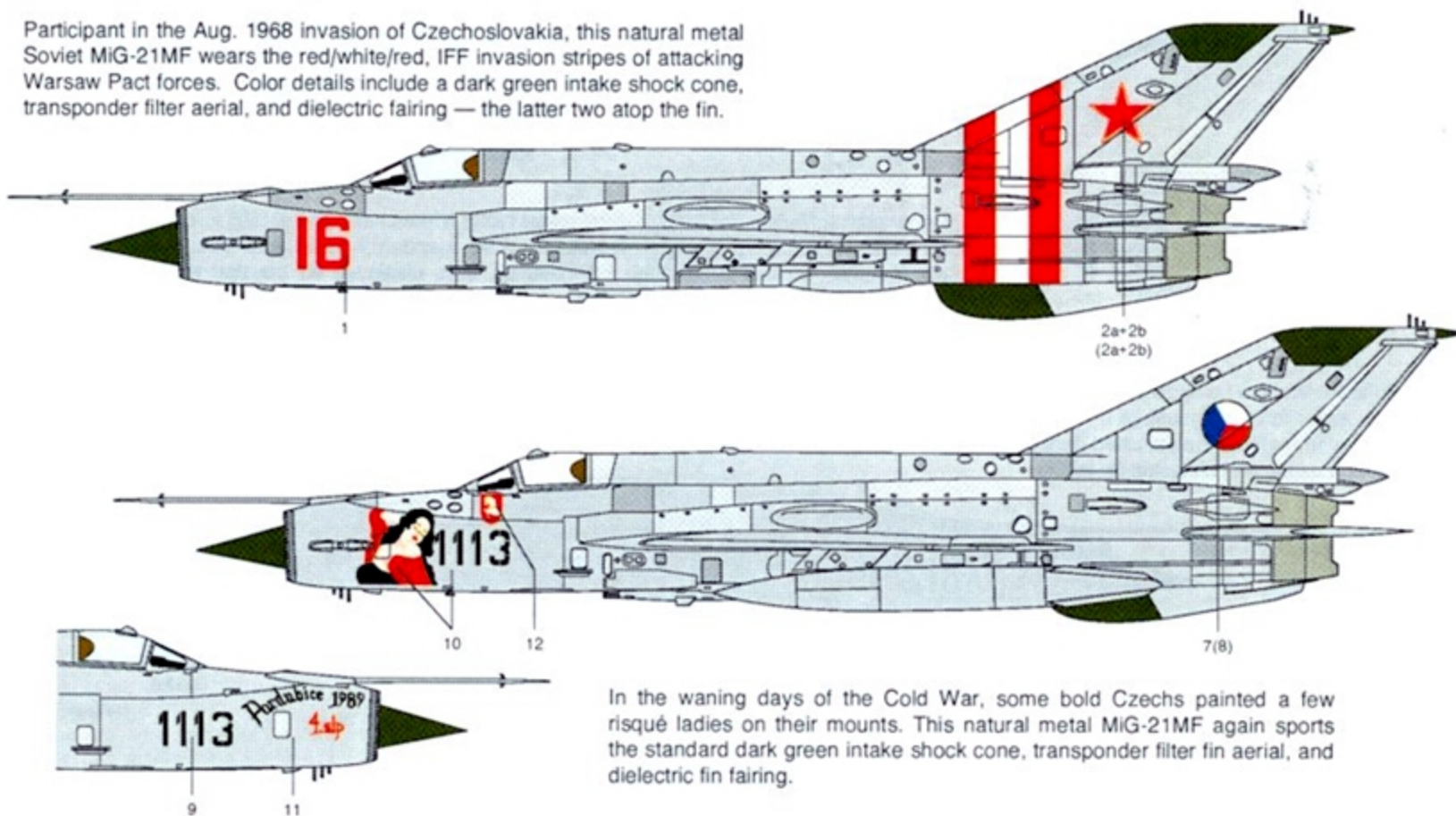

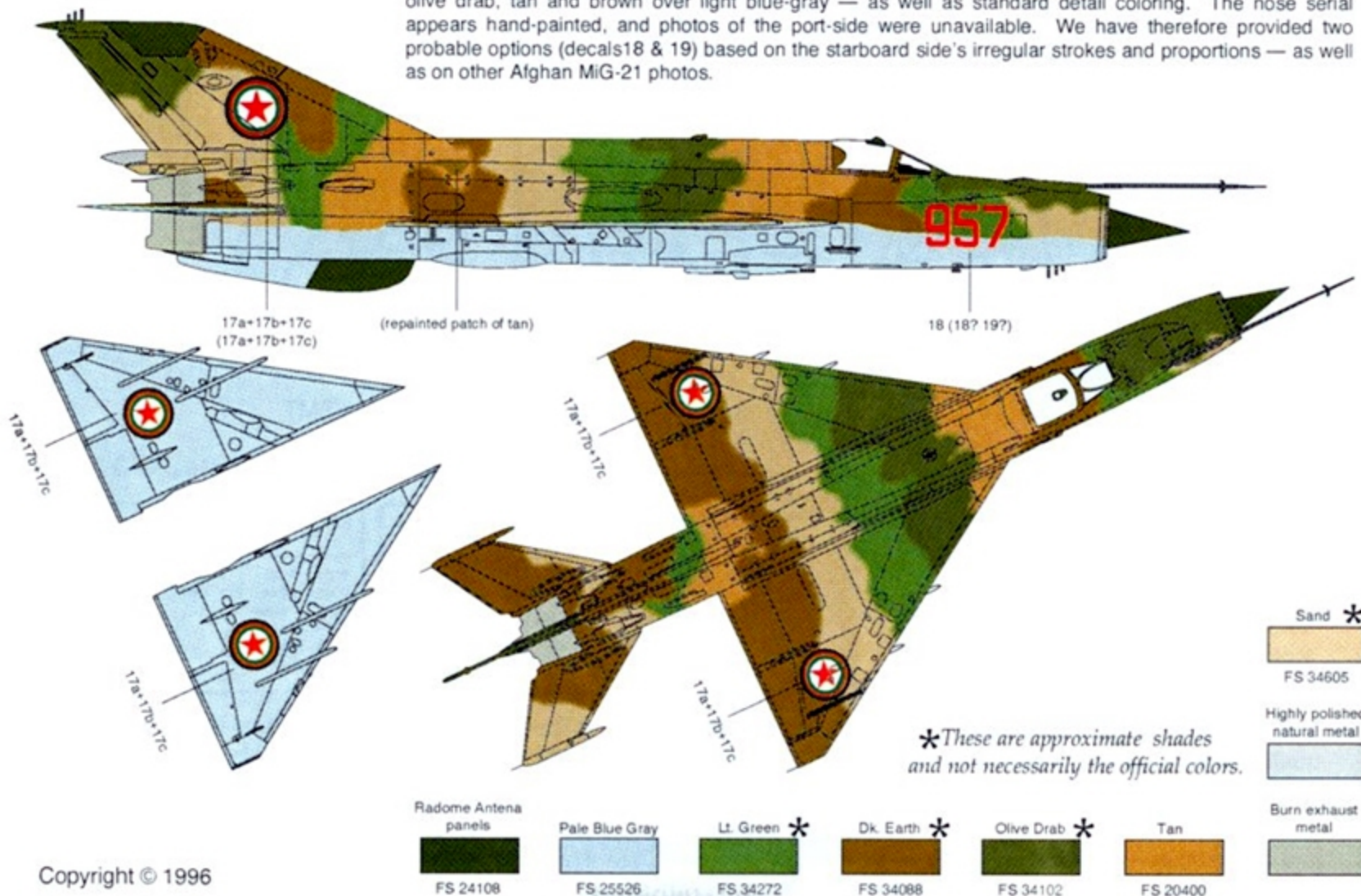

Participant in the Aug. 1968 invasion of Czechoslovakia, this natural metal Soviet MiG-21MF wears the red/white/red, IFF invasion stripes of attacking Warsaw Pact forces. Color details include a dark green intake shock cone, transponder filter aerial, and dielectric fining — the latter two atop the fin.



In the waning days of the Cold War, some bold Czechs painted a few risqué ladies on their mounts. This natural metal MiG-21MF again sports the standard dark green intake shock cone, transponder filter fin aerial, and dielectric fin fairing.

A defector to Pakistan in Feb. 1989, this Afghan MiG-21MF wears a field-applied scheme of light green, olive drab, tan and brown over light blue-gray — as well as standard detail coloring. The nose serial appears hand-painted, and photos of the port-side were unavailable. We have therefore provided two probable options (decals 18 & 19) based on the starboard side's irregular strokes and proportions — as well as on other Afghan MiG-21 photos.

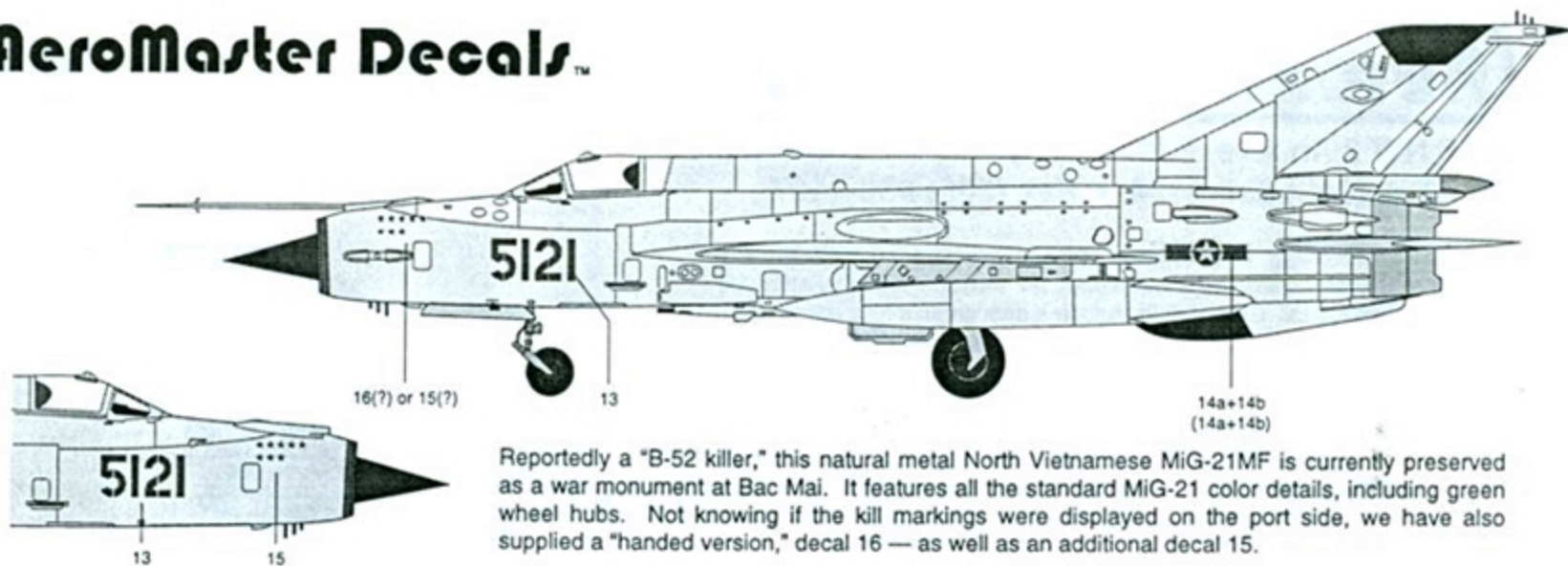

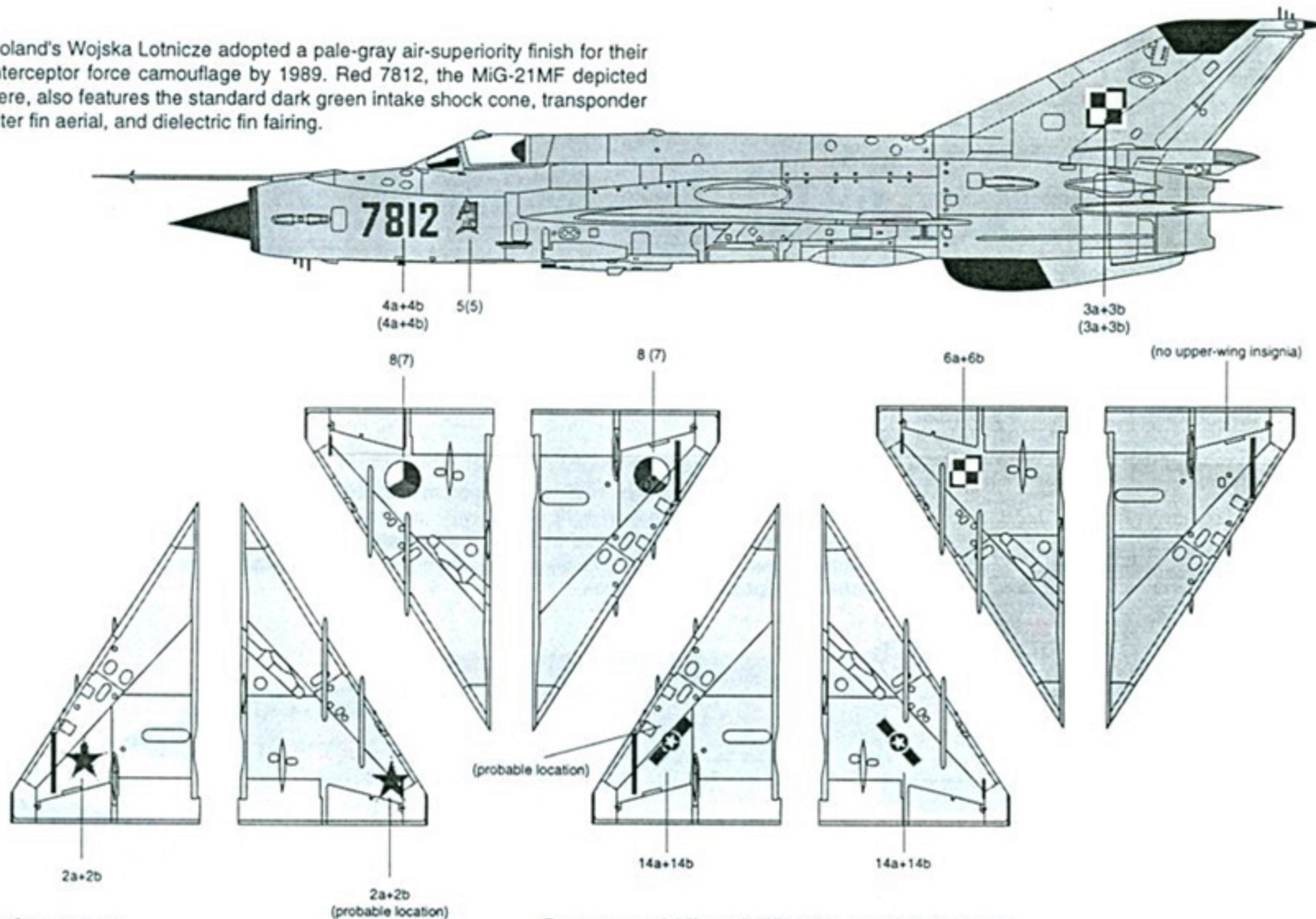


# AeroMaster Decals™



Reportedly a "B-52 killer," this natural metal North Vietnamese MiG-21MF is currently preserved as a war monument at Bac Mai. It features all the standard MiG-21 color details, including green wheel hubs. Not knowing if the kill markings were displayed on the port side, we have also supplied a "handed version," decal 16 — as well as an additional decal 15.

Poland's Wojska Lotnicze adopted a pale-gray air-superiority finish for their interceptor force camouflage by 1989. Red 7812, the MiG-21MF depicted here, also features the standard dark green intake shock cone, transponder filter fin aerial, and dielectric fin fairing.
