

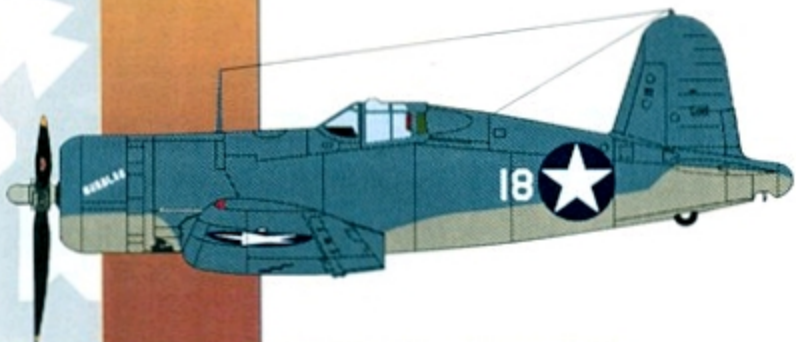

White lines over Corsair upper Decks were sealing tape placed over the fuel lower access panels, which had a tendency to leak over the windshield. They did not look necessarily alike. This set should fit all the available Corsair kits.

F4U-1D Corsair, VF-17. Flown by Lt. j.g. Ira Kepford, during February 1944. Sea Blue / Inter. Blue / White camouflage. Note: modify item 39 to match drawing. Prop hub, Boss and possibly front engine crankcase in Intermediate Blue. Notice lack of antenna masts. Photo ref. 3 page 60.

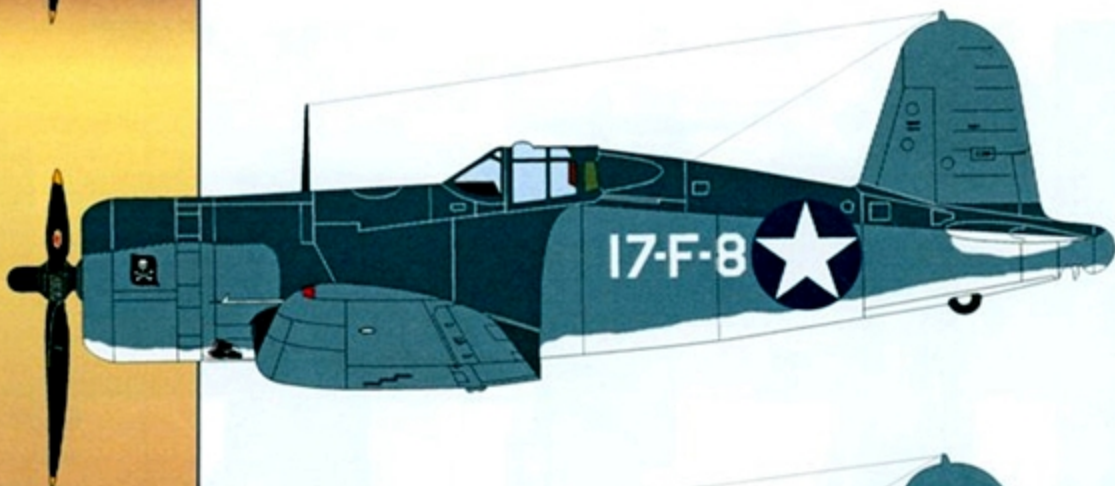
F4U-1D Corsair, VMF-214. Flown by Maj. Gregory Boyington. Sea Blue/ Inter. Blue/ White camouflage. Black propeller with Yellow tips.

F4U-1, VF-17, embarked on USS Bunker Hill (CV-17). July 1943. Non specular Sea Blue, Intermediate Blue, and White. Folding wing panels are Inter. Blue. Roundels on 4 position only, wings, left upper, right lower. Black propeller with Yellow tips.

F4U-1 No. 18, Nick named "Bubbles" of VF-124, Guadalcanal 1943. Camouflaged in Dk. Blue Gray (FS 35189) and Lt Gray (FS 36440). "BUBBLES" may not have appeared on right side. Black propeller blades, Yellow tips and Natural Metal hub & boss.
