


He 162 A1/A2,A9 Salamander



History in brief

Heinkel He 162 Spatz was a German jet fighter that served with the Luftwaffe in the final months of World War II. The aircraft was also known as the Volksjäger (people's fighter) or, incorrectly, the Salamander (Newt). Serial production started in January 1945 and the main production variant was the He 162 A-2 with BMW 003E-1 engines and two Mauser MG 151/20 20 mm cannons. A small series of the A-1 version with 30 mm MK 108 cannons was also produced, but otherwise it was no different from the A-2. The He 162A-9 version was to have butterfly tail surfaces. Other variants considered included the He 162C with a swept wing and butterfly tail surfaces, the He 162D with a similar design, only with the wings swept in the opposite direction. The He 162C and He 162D did not get further than a prototype prototype that could be fitted with sweep or inverted sweep wings found by the Allies when they occupied the Schwechat factory. Performance was great, much better than RLM required. The He 162 could reach 890 km/h at low altitude and 905 km/h at 5,950 m.


