













USAF F-4s have had a wide variety of stencil types applied during their long career. Most of the time, these were applied during a total repaint of the jet at depot level maintenance, resulting in a somewhat standard assortment of stencils in size and location. However, there were many variations on the 'standard', especially late in the Phantom's career. Consult the aircraft-specific profiles and your references carefully for non-standard stencils and/or placement. F-4E 68-0450 of the 347TFW is the only jet to use yellow stencils on the bottom of the jet. All others use black or contrasting gray (Hill II jets).
