



#### Messerschmitt Bf 109 E-3 'Yellow 25'

Jagdfliegerschule 1. Trondheim, Norway, February 1942. 'Yellow 25 flew as part of the unit designated, 'Kommando Losigkeit'. This was tasked with the duty of providing air defense to convoys off the Norwegian coast. Note that this aircraft is still carrying factory codes besides its yellow training unit number.

also the FuG 16 ZE radio antenna.



Oblt. Heinz Klöpper 7./JG1. Leeuwarden, Holland, November 1943 Heinz Klöpper was the Staffelkapitän of 7./JG1 with a total of 91 victories at this time. Note the miniature 'Ritterkreuz' on the White fin denoting 50 of his victories.

### Messerschmitt Bf 109 G-6 'White 3'

7./JG1. Leeuwarden, Holland, late 1943. The end of 1943 saw the introduction of a new JG1 emblem - a red-winged 'I'. 'White 3' carries the new emblem together with the red JG1 'Defense of the Reich' rear fuselage band and III Gruppe vertical bar.

Oblt. Hans Mohr, Gruppe Technical Officer II./JG1 Woensdrecht, Holland, April 1943, As well as the chevron/circle insignia of the II Gruppe Technical Officer and Green 'Tatzelwurm', Hans Mohr's aircraft also carries his own personal emblem below the cockpit.
