



British Ar 234



American Ar 234's



Two Ar 234 B-2's were captured by the British at Grove in Denmark and flown to England for testing and display.

This decal depicts Wr. Nr. 140466 as displayed at Farnborough, along with other captured aircraft, after the War. It has roughly hand painted British markings and serial VK877. When applying the fuselage roundels with the yellow rings keep the same orientation as on the decal sheet so that the rings "fit" correctly.

Camouflage colours are 81, 83 and 76 with the original German markings painted out with a shade lighter than either 81 or 83.

"Jane 1" and "Snafu 1" are the two Ar 234 B-2's given to the U.S. Navy for testing after WW 11. They were seized from KG 76 at Stavanger in Norway by Colonel Watsons team.

This decal sheet includes the American markings applied over the painted out German ones at that time. Nonstandard stars-and-bars, the numbers 202 and 303 names and "Watson's Wizzers" badge with pilot and crew chiefs name underneath. Various German stensil markings remained in place with only the German National and Squadron insignia being painted out with a shade similar in tone (on B/W photograph) to "81". Possibly American olive drab or a paint obtained locally in Norway.

Camouflage for both aircraft was almost certainly 81 (brown violet) and 83 (bright green) over 76 (light blue).
