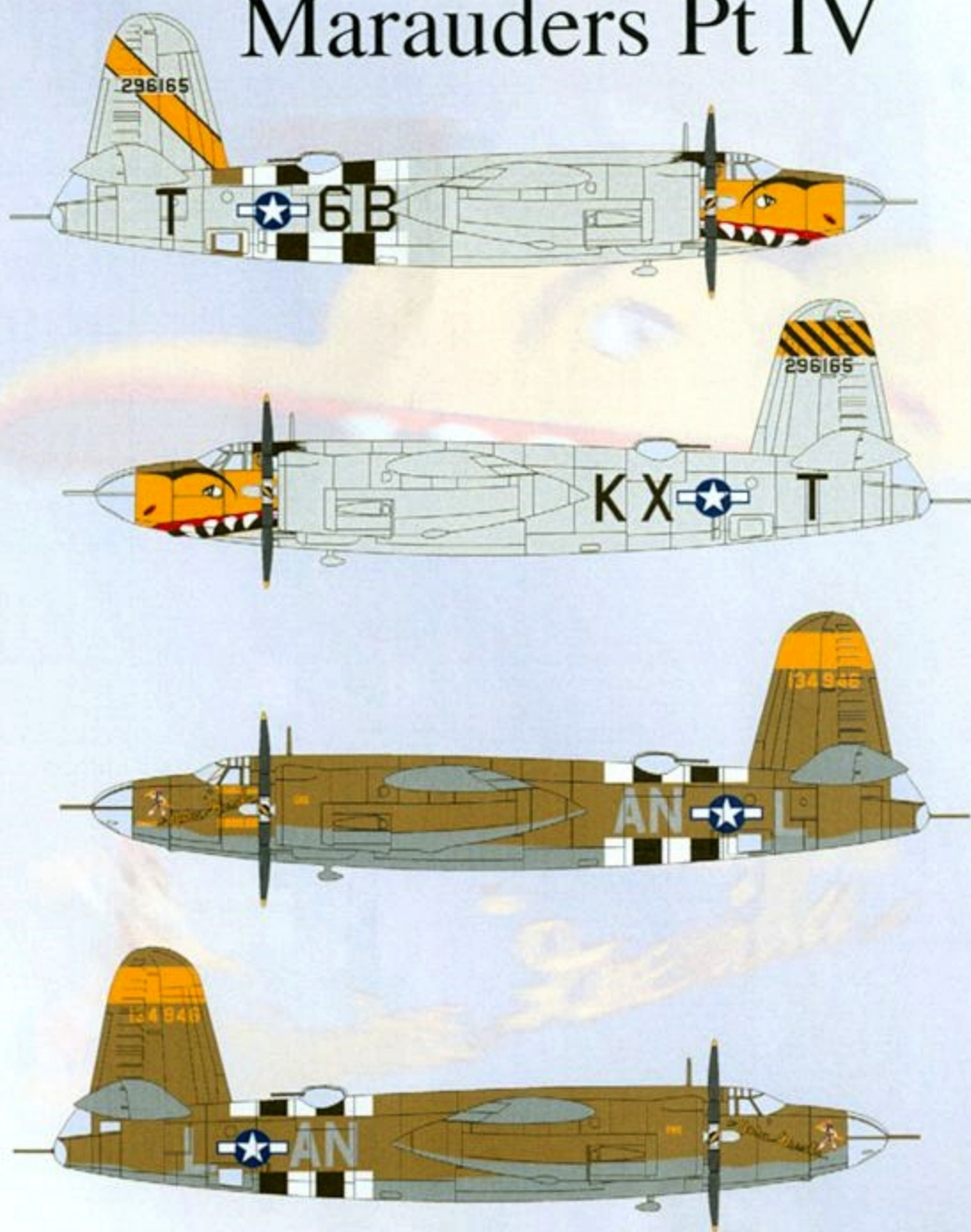


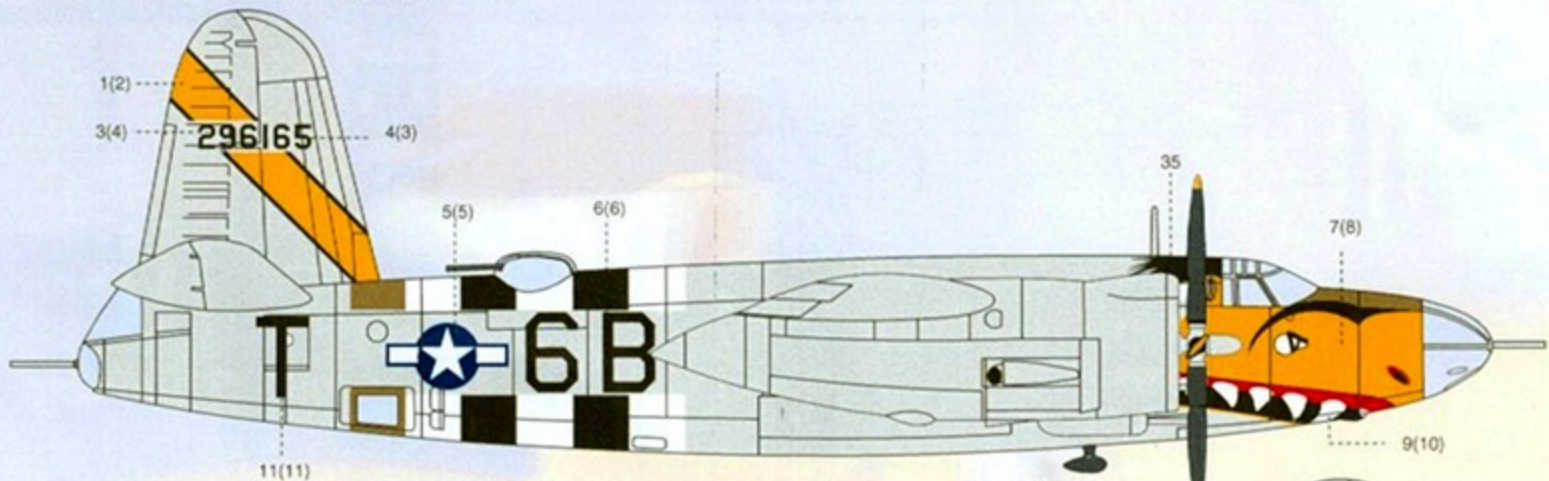

Suggested Kit: Monogram B-26 Marauder

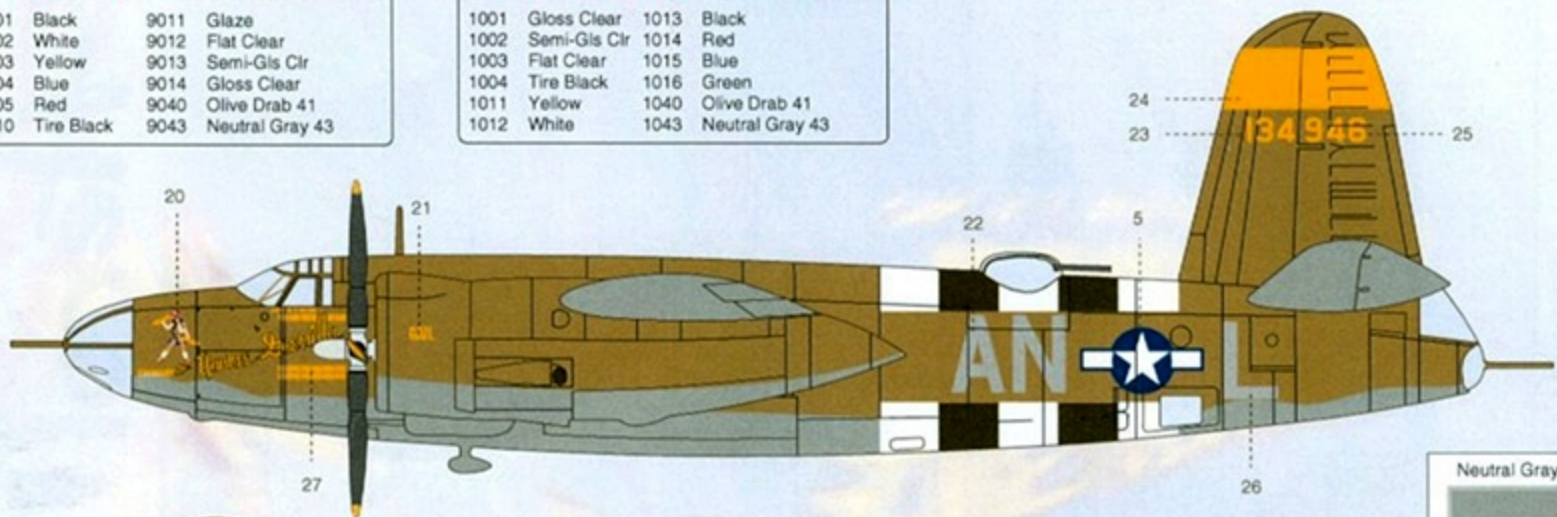


A/C 1: This most flamboyant of all Marauders, flew with the 599th BS, 397th BG. The Big Hairy Bird had full invasion stripes and a diagonal fin/rudder band. Flown by a pilot named Shaeffer, the A/C flew with the 397th BG, and then was passed onto the 387th before the end of the war. We provide you both codes and Squadron Markings in case you do not want to bother with D-Day bands. Notice that serial#s do not change. Photos on page 67, reference 1. A/C may have had a tongue sticking out of its mouth over the upper right gun cover, but it is not clear on the photos we have. We leave that to the modellers discretion.

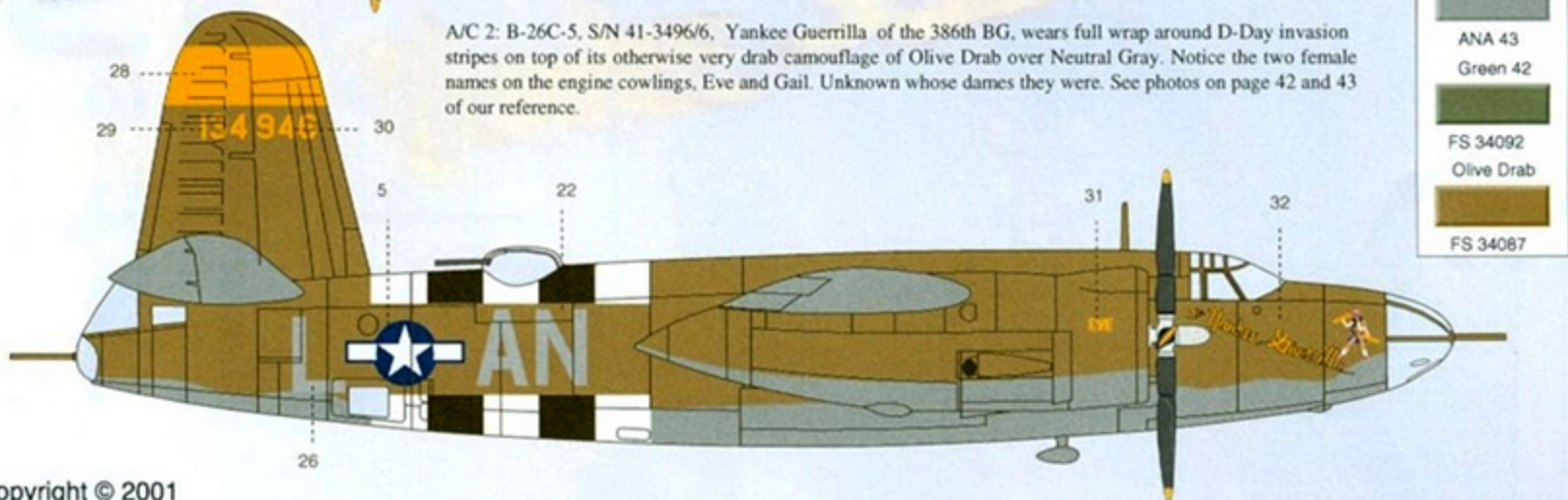

A/C 2: B-26C-5, S/N 41-3496/6, Yankee Guerrilla of the 386th BG, wears full wrap around D-Day invasion stripes on top of its otherwise very drab camouflage of Olive Drab over Neutral Gray. Notice the two female names on the engine cowlings, Eve and Gail. Unknown whose dames they were. See photos on page 42 and 43 of our reference.
