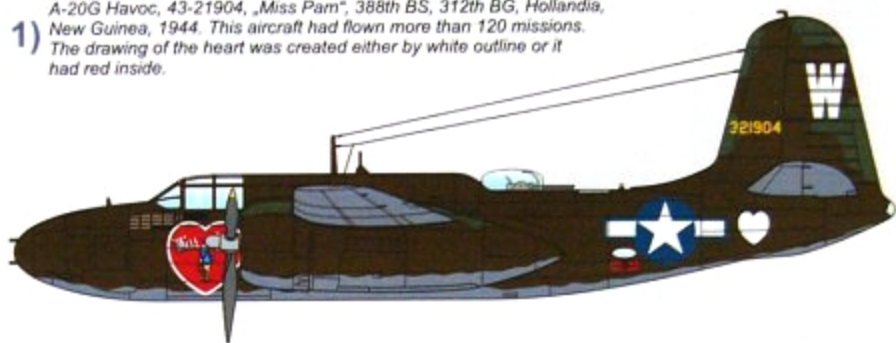
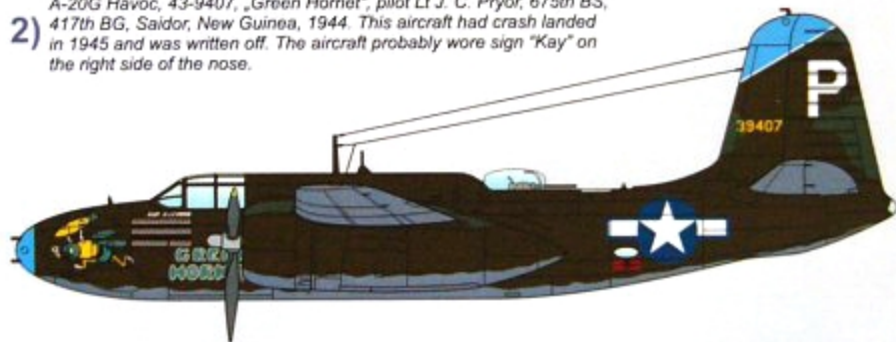


# A-20 HAVOC

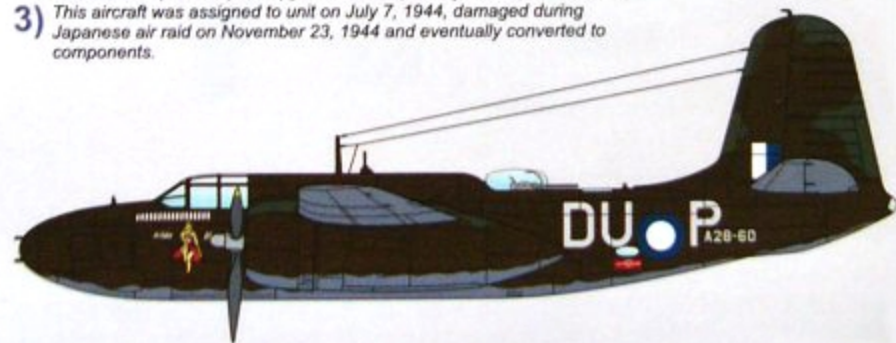
- 1) A-20G Havoc, 43-21904, „Miss Pam“, 388th BS, 312th BG, Hollandia, New Guinea, 1944. This aircraft had flown more than 120 missions. The drawing of the heart was created either by white outline or it had red inside.

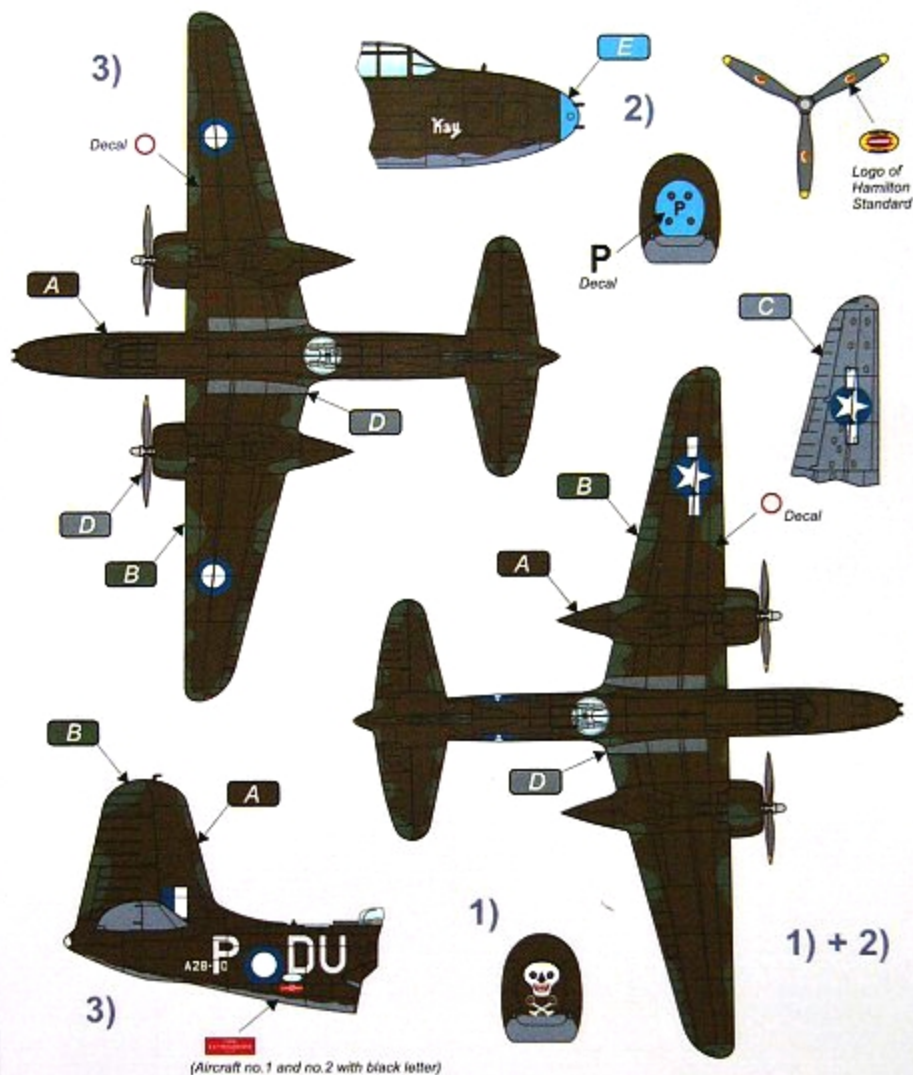


- 2) A-20G Havoc, 43-9407, „Green Hornet“, pilot Lt J. C. Pryor, 675th BS, 417th BG, Saidor, New Guinea, 1944. This aircraft had crash landed in 1945 and was written off. The aircraft probably wore sign "Kay" on the right side of the nose.



- 3) A-20G Havoc, A28-60, DU-P, „Hilda Shane“, 22 Sqn RAAF, New Guinea. This aircraft was assigned to unit on July 7, 1944, damaged during Japanese air raid on November 23, 1944 and eventually converted to components.
