


P-47D-22-RE 42-26387 of the 82nd FS, 78th FG, 8th AF, based at Duxford, England, November 1944. victories, pilot(s) unknown. controversy exists over Miss Behave's colors. Some sources say RAF Dark Green and Sky were used for camouflage and others claim that US Dark Olive Drab was used over Gray or Natural Metal undersurfaces. Invasion stripes on the lower fuselage half only. Note the original Natural Metal showing through the rear window panel and the pinkish hue in the rudder where the White ID strip was covered with Red paint. Hamilton Standard propeller. Codes on right side read W+MX.


P-47D-22-RE 42-26044 of the 61st FS, 56th FG, 8th AF, based at Boxted, England in July 1944. The Natural Metal *Silver Lady* was flown by Major Leslie Smith. During the Summer of 1944 she was flown by a number of other pilots assigned to the 61st, including F/Lt. Witold "Lanny" Lanowski of the Polish Air Force, and displayed seven kill markings. Dark Olive Drab antiglare panel. Invasion stripes on the lower fuselage half only. Note the Hamilton Standard propeller. Crown marking on both sides of cowi. Codes on right side read Z•HV.

P-47D-28-RA 42-28839 of the 392nd FS, 367th FG, 9th AF, based at St. Dizier, France, in April of 1945. Natural Metal Finish with Dark Olive Drab antiglare panels. The Red lightning flash was the personal marking of the unknown pilot. Note the Red spinner on the 13-foot diameter Curtiss Wright propeller. Codes on right side read W•H5. Place Red lightning bolt before data block, codes and insignia.

P-47D-28-RA 42-29147 The Turtle No. 10 of the 509th FS, 405th FG, 9th AF, based in France in early 1945. Pilot unknown. Natural Metal Finish with Dark Olive Drab antiglare panels. Invasion stripes on the lower fuselage half only. The 13' Curtiss Wright prop has a Red spinner. Codes on right side read K•G9. Photo on War Paint.








P-47D-25-RE 42-26635 of the 82nd FS, 78th FG, 8th AF, based at Duxford, England, July 1944. One victory plus one apparent ship kill markings displayed; the pilot was Lt. Howard Scholz. Its color scheme is also in question. We show US Dark Olive Drab over the original Natural Metal undersurfaces, but MX•E could have been camouflaged in US Medium Green or RAF Dark Green over Sky or another combination. Invasion stripes under the wings and fuselage. White ID stripes with Black outlines carried on tail surfaces. Ham standard paddle bladed prop. Codes on right side read E•MX.
