The Armée de l'Air ordered 113 2-seat, AD4N night-attack Skyraiders in 1956 to the US Navy and deliveries commenced in 1958. The Skyraiders were stripped of their specialized equipment and operated as conventional, daylight close-support aircraft. The Skyraiders had only a short career in Algeria. But they nonetheless proved to be the most successful of all the ad hoc COIN airplanes deployed by the French. The AD4Ns continued in active service after the Algerian War until the late 1970s. They were heavily involved in the civil war in Chad, at first with the Armée de l'Air, and later with a nominally independent local air force staffed by French mercenaries. The aircraft also operated under the French flag in Djibouti and on the island of Madagascar.
