

LATE FAR EAST SPITFIRES Part 1 1945-1954

FR Mk.XVIII NH850/Z

60 Squadron, Malaya, December 1950. Sqn. Ldr, WG Duncan Smith. 60 Squadron played an important role in the anti-terrorist war in Malaya providing air strikes and offensive support against the communist terrorists. Ocean Grey and Dark Green camouflage with Medium Sea Grey undersurfaces. Red & Blue spinner and 60 Sqn Yellow and Black nose bands. Starboard side reads ¥Z.





RN218. Right side scrap view showing overpainted Type Cl 36" roundel (19mm diameter) and earnera port in 'fresher' Ocean Grey and positioning of codes with SEAC roundel.

FR Mk.XIVe RN218/MS-F

273 Squadron, Tan Son Nhut, Saigon, French Indo-China, Autumn 1945. RN218 acted as part of the escort for Air Chief Marshall Sir Keith Park, the allied C in C on his visit to Singapore in December 1945. The aircraft carries regular SEAC markings of Ocean Grey & Dark Green camouflage and Medium Sea Grey undersurfaces. White theatre ID bands were 18" (9.5mm) wide on tail and fin and 28" (14.8mm) wide on wing surfaces. Spinner was also white. Note over painting of 36" roundel (19mm) with 'fresher' Dark Green paint.

PR Mk.XIX PS888

81 Squadron, Malaya, 1954. PS888 was one of the last operational Spitfires with the RAF carrying out photo-reconnaissance sorties against the Malayan terrorists. Overall PR Blue with Medium Sea Grey high demarcation down the fuselage spine. Upper surfaces of wings and tail, plus spinner tip were also Medium Sea Grey.







VP459 Scrap view showing pre-July markings and camouflage as an alternative scheme.

800 Squadron, HMS Triumph, South China Sea, July 1950. HMS Triumph was part of the allied Task Force 77 which carried out attacks against communist targets in Korea throughout the summer and autumn of 1950. VP459 is shown with overall Sky finish and Extra Dark Sea Grey high demarcation fuselage, upper surfaces of wings and tail. 12" (6.3mm) Black and White Korean theatre ID bands on fuselage and wing surfaces. Wing fillets may have been Extra Dark Sea Grey on this A/C.
