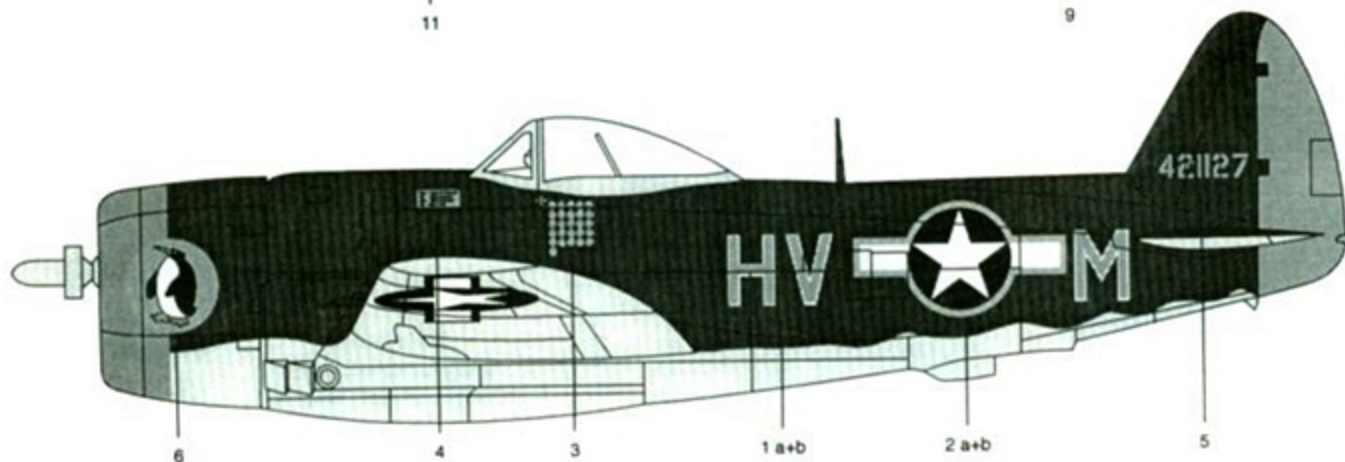
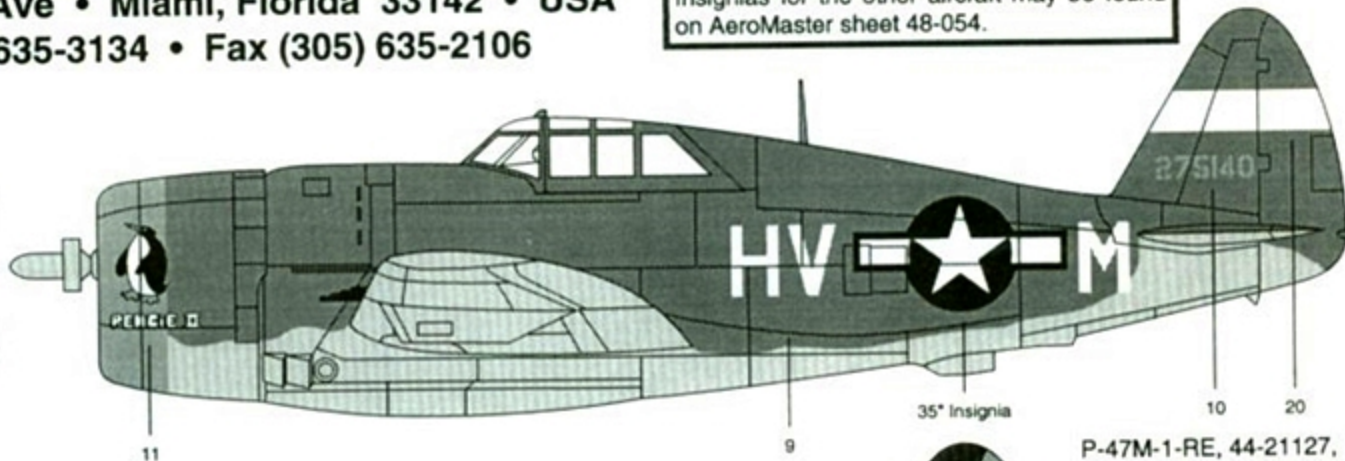

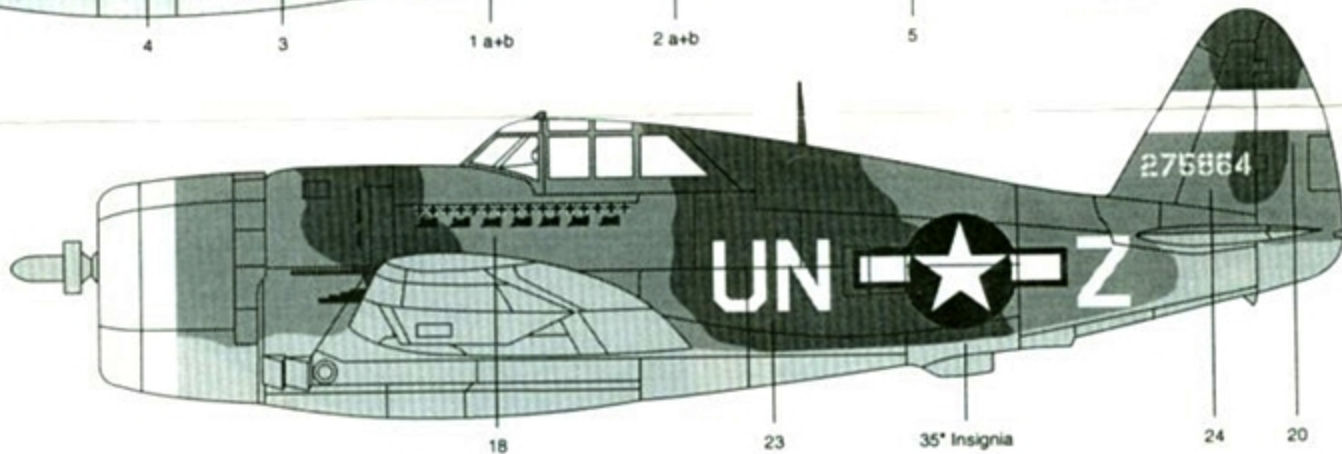

P-47D-10-RE, 42-75140, "Pengie II", 61st FS, 56th FG, Boxted, England, March 1944. Flown by Capt. Michael Gladych (Polish). Olive Drab and Neutral Gray camouflage with red forward cowl.



P-47M-1-RE, 44-21127, "Pengie V", 61st FS, Boxted, England, 1945. Flown by Capt. Michael Gladych. Semi-gloss black fuselage (some sources state extremely dark midnight blue) with natural metal belly and wing & horizontal stabilizer leading edges. Red forward cowl and rudder. Canopy frames natural metal.



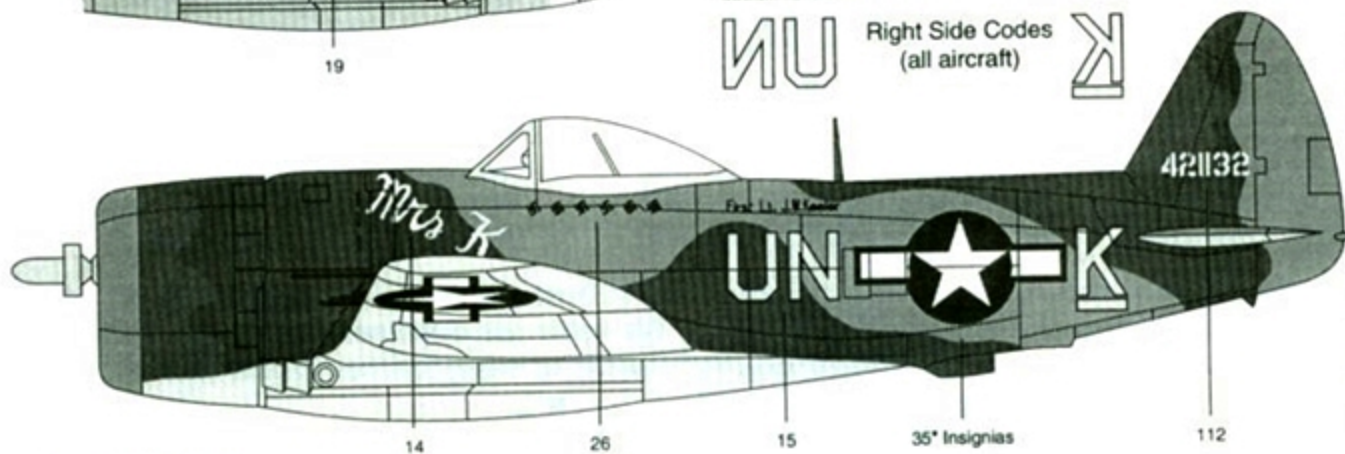
P-47D-20-RE, possibly 42-75864, "Moi Tovarishch 2/My Comrade 2", 63rd FS, Boxted, England, spring 1944. Flown by Col. Hubert "Hub" Zemke, 56th FG Commander. Aircraft reportedly camouflaged in RAF Ocean Grey and U.S. Medium Green 42 over Neutral Gray. Forward cowl white. Exact field applied camouflage pattern not known.

P-47M-1-RE, 44-21132, "Mrs. K.", 63rd FS, Boxted, England, 1945. Flown by 1st Lt. John Keeler. Insignia blue (F.S. 15044) and azure blue (F.S. 35231) camouflage with natural metal lower surfaces. Camouflage wraps around belly aft of wings. Forward cowl red. Canopy frames natural metal. Right side camouflage pattern similar to left.
