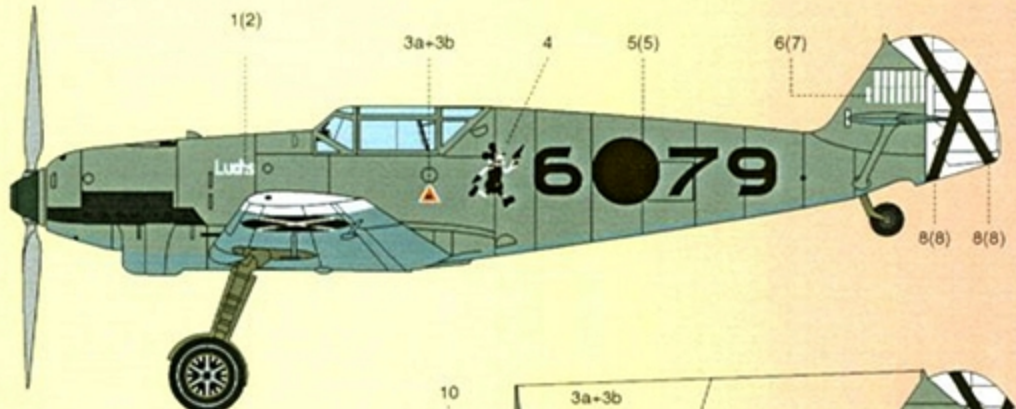

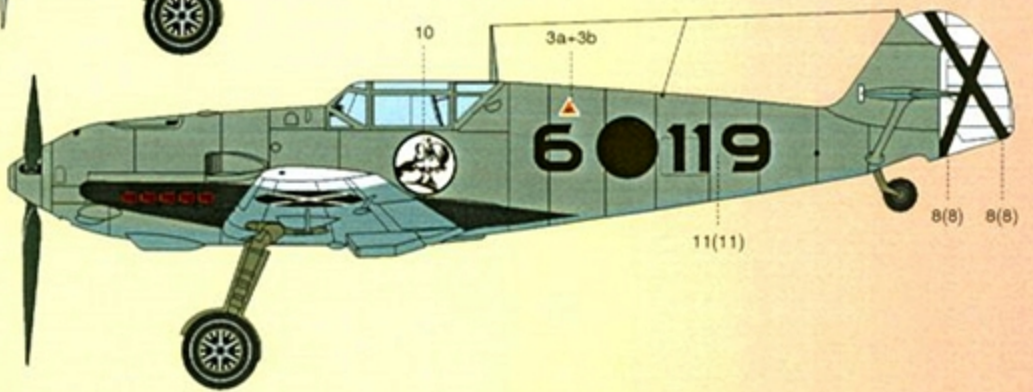
These Decals are based on: "The Spanish Civil War"



Christened "Luchs" (Lynx), Werner Mölders' Bf109D wears RLM 63 Hellgrau over RLM 63 Hellblau. Note the black painted exhaust area, aluminum prop and RLM 70 (or black) spinner. See page 169/170.



Depicted as it appeared at the end of hostilities, this Bf109E-1 of 1/J.88 again wears RLM 63 Hellgrau over RLM 65 Hellblau. Note the long, Black painted exhaust area, (modeller must paint) RLM 70 (or black) prop and RLM 63 spinner. See page 116.

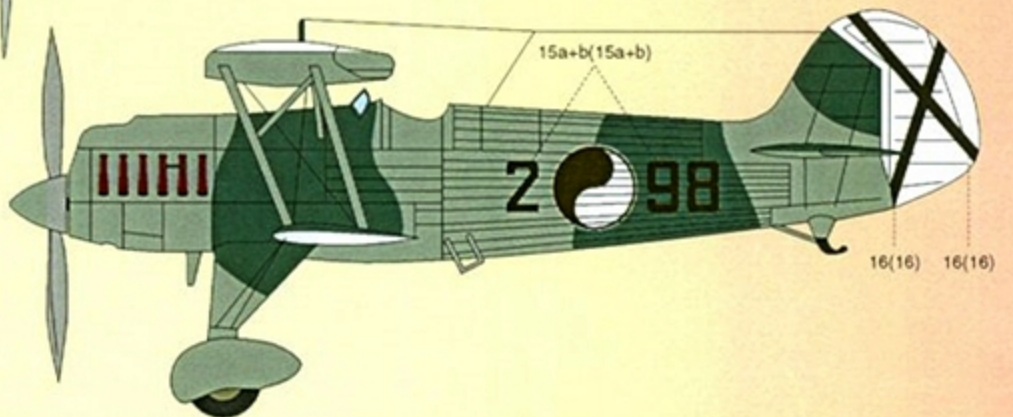

This Bf109B-2 based at Leon wears swathes of RLM 62 Dunkelgrün over RLM 63 Hellgrau — with RLM 65 Hellblau undersurfaces. Note the black painted exhaust area. Aluminum prop with RLM 62 spinner. Some sources list the upper-surface shades as RLM 70/71. See page 131.



Lt. Kurt Strümpell's He51 of 3/J.88 wears RLM 62 Dunkelgrün over RLM 63 Hellgrau. Aluminum prop with RLM 63 spinner. Note the positions of the rudder cross stripes. A/C may have had a wrap around RLM 63 scheme (?). See page 145.



While commanding 3.J/88, Staffelkapitän Adolph Galland scored his first triumphs in He 51 "2-78". His machine wears a decidedly DARK upper-surface camouflage — probably RLM 61 Braun and RLM 62 Grün over RLM 65 Hellblau camouflage. Note the RLM 62 /aluminum prop spinner. See page 143.
