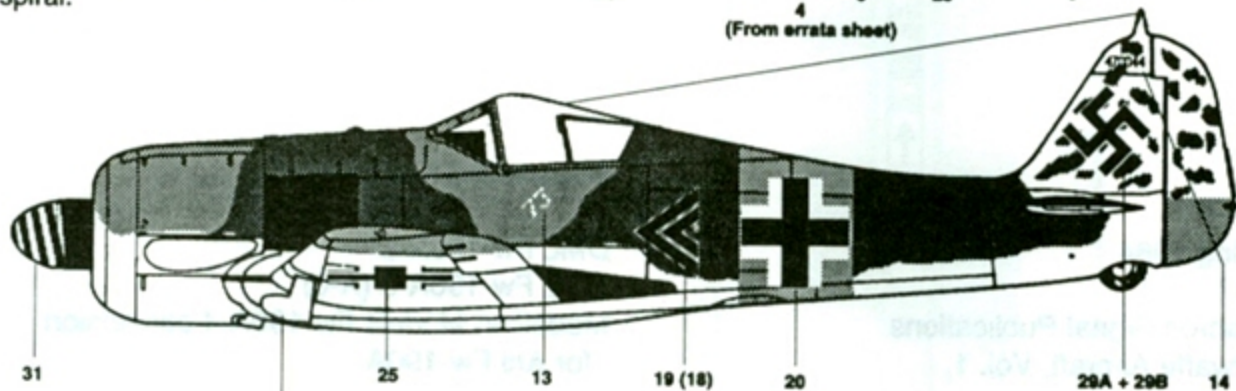
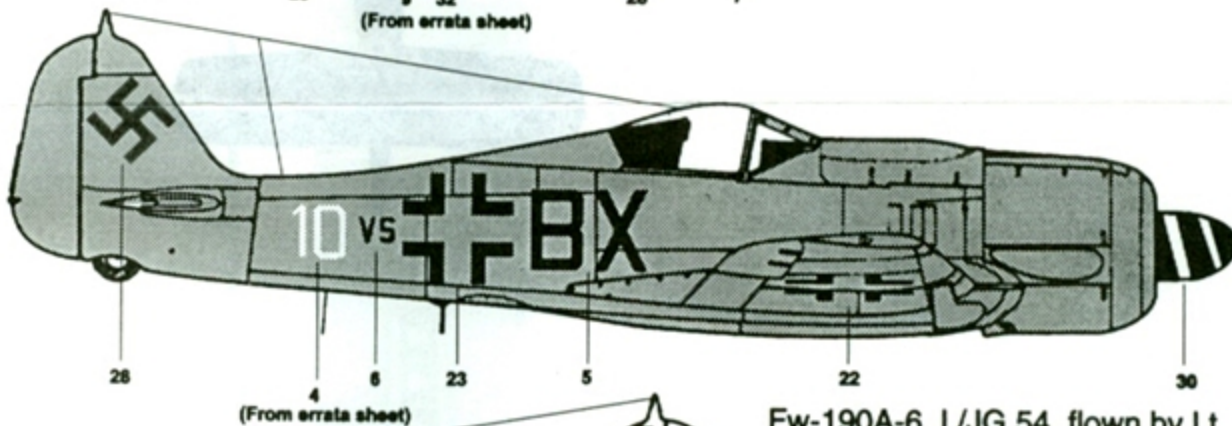
NOTE: Due to a printing error, there is an errata sheet enclosed for several items. Discard items on large sheet and substitute items from errata sheet.

Fw-190A-8, 7./JG 300, Altenberg, Germany, 1945. RLM 74/75/76 camouflage with black spinner and forward cowl ring



Fw-190A-8, w. nr. 490044, II./JG 301, Germany, 1945. RLM 74/75/76 camouflage. Spinner black with white spiral stripe.

Fw-190A-8, unit unknown, found by Allied troops at Bad Aibling, Germany, 1945. Aircraft roughly oversprayed with RLM 76 over standard 74/75/76 camouflage. Black swastika and white upper wing crosses nearly covered with 76, fuselage markings apparently painted after application of 76 coat. Spinner black with white spiral.



Fw-190A-6, I./JG 54, flown by Lt. Walter Nowotny, Eastern Front, 1943. RLM 74/75/76 camouflage with overpainting in two shades of green on upper surfaces. Yellow fuselage band, lower wingtips and bottom of rudder. Black spinner with white spiral. References on this aircraft vary considerably. Consult references to draw your own conclusions on colors.

Note: The Fw-190A-6 was fitted with inboard main wheel doors.

Fw-190A-4, Stab. II./JG 1, flown by Gruppe Technical Officer, Oblt. Hans Mohr, Woensdrecht, Holland, March 1943. RLM 74/75/76 camouflage with yellow lower cowl section. Spinner RLM 70 with white spiral.
