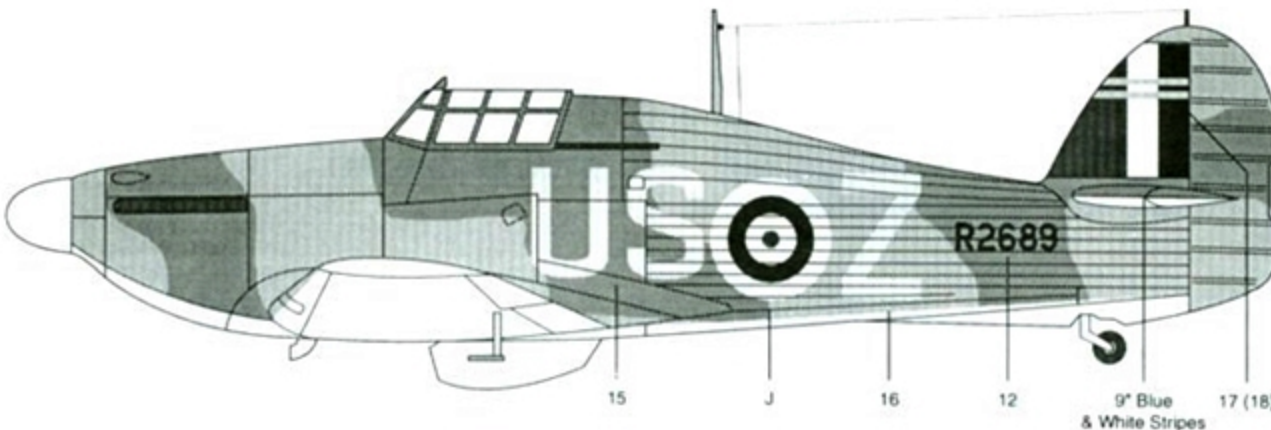
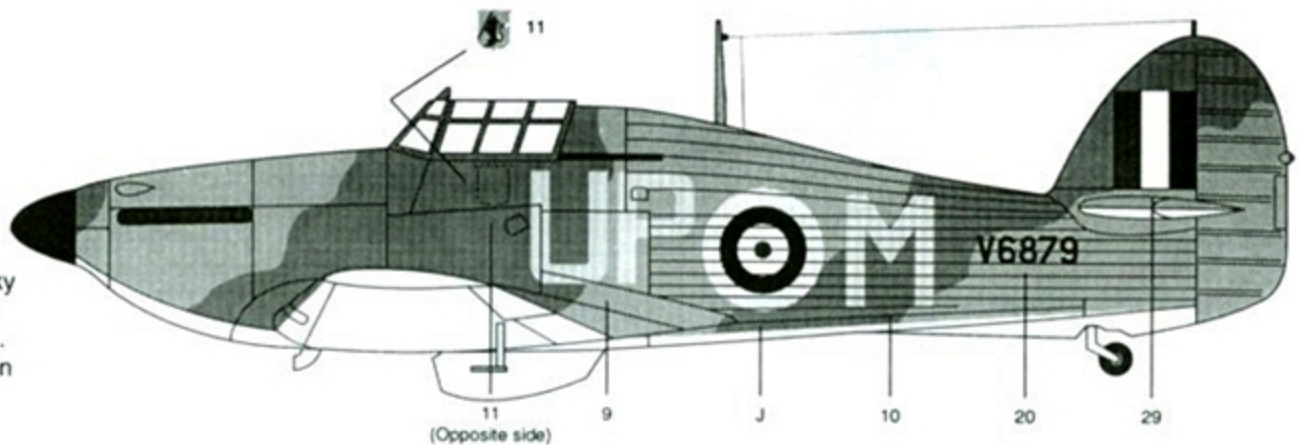
In order to provide as many aircraft choices as possible we have provided only a limited selection of national insignias. Additional insignias may be found on AeroMaster Sheet 48-026, corresponding to the letters indicated.

Hurricane Mk.1, P3039, "Bébé", 229 Sqdn, RAF Northolt, September 1940. Flown by P/O V. Ortmans (Belgian). RAF Dark Earth, Dark Green and Sky camouflage with black spinner. Squadron code forward of roundel on starboard side.



Hurricane Mk.1, V6702, 504 Sqdn, RAF Filton, September 1940. Dark Earth, Dark Green and Sky camouflage with black spinner. Squadron code probably aft of roundel on starboard side.

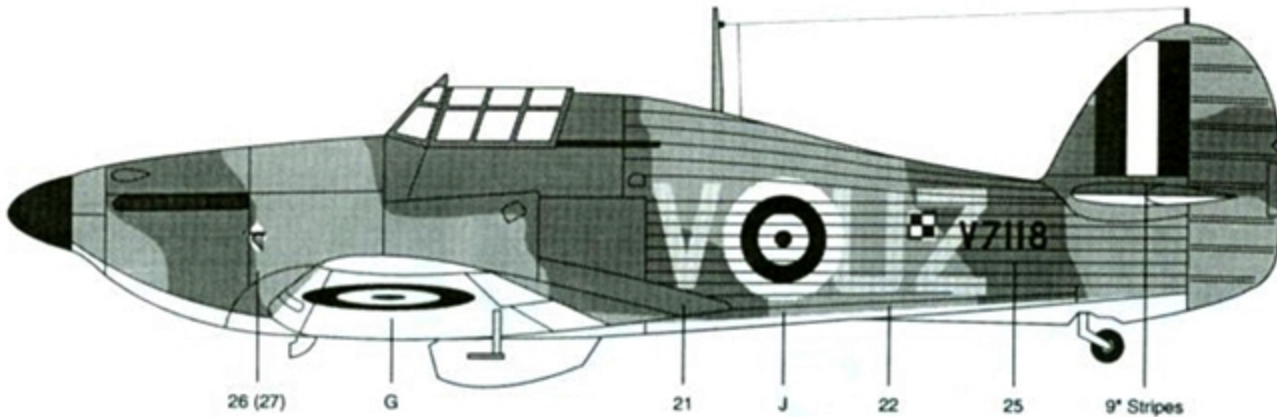
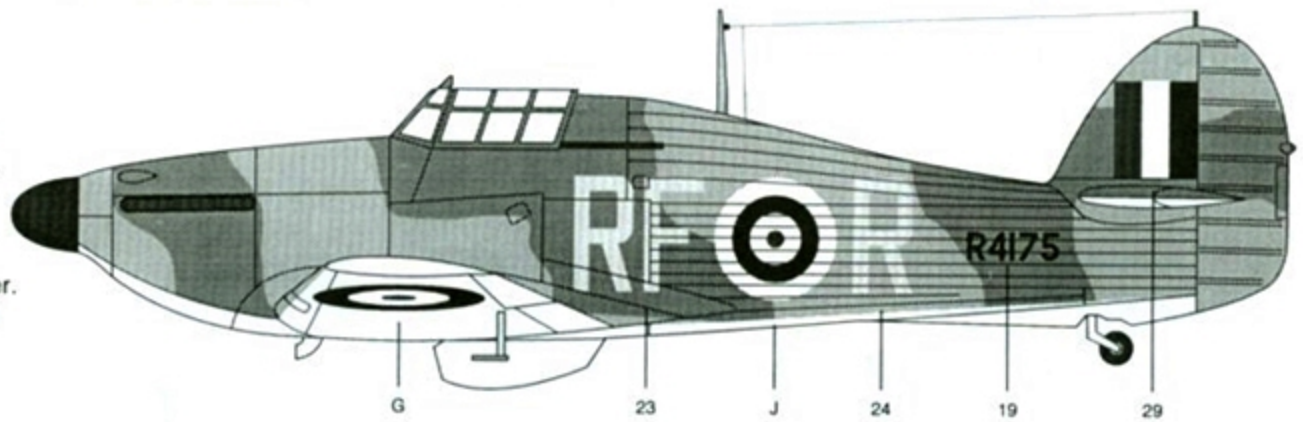
Hurricane Mk.1, V6879, 605 Sqdn, RAF Croydon, October 1940. Flown by S/Ldr A. McKellar, DSO, DFC & bar. Dark Earth, Dark Green and Sky camouflage with black spinner. No lower wing roundels carried. Squadron code aft of roundel on starboard side.



Hurricane Mk.1, R2689, 56 Sqdn, RAF North Weald, August 1940. Dark Earth, Dark Green and Sky camouflage with Sky spinner. No lower wing roundels carried. Squadron code aft of roundel on starboard side. Note that the entire forward portion of the fin is Dull Red. Use extra red decal provided.

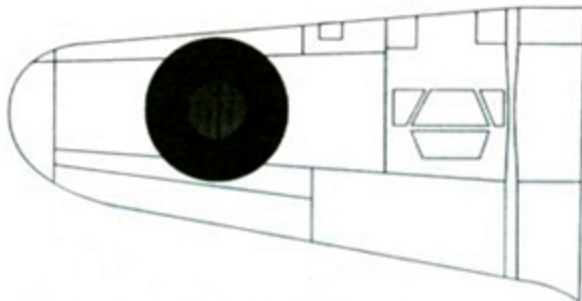

Hurricane Mk.1, R4175, 303 Sqn, RAF Northolt, October 1940. Flown by Sgt J. Frantisek (Czech). Dark Earth, Dark Green and Sky camouflage with black spinner. Squadron code aft of roundel on starboard side.

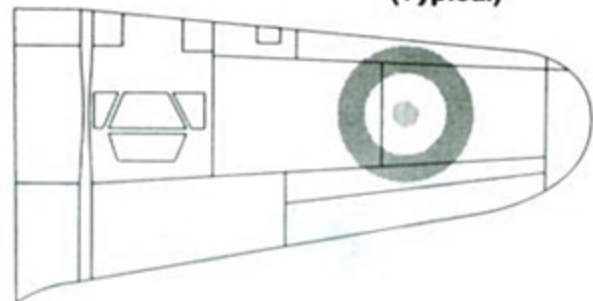


Hurricane Mk.1, V7118, 306 (Polish) Sqn, October 1940. Dark Earth, Dark Green and Sky camouflage with black spinner. Note that the serial and fuselage roundel are painted over the squadron and aircraft identification codes. Squadron code aft of roundel on starboard side.

We have not attempted to show upper surface camouflage information. Much has been published on these aircraft, and we suggest using kit provided camouflage drawings as well as consulting the many references available on the Battle of Britain for further information.
