



Kommodore of JG 54. Notice whitewash on White/RLM 70 spinner. To simulate the white wash camouflage paint, we recommend that:

- 1. Paint the aircraft as it originally looked.
- With a very thinned out White paint, CAREFULLY, apply an irregular and uneven coat of White, not trying to cover all of the basic scheme underneath. Be careful with the White wash and runs. They could spoil your model.
- With regular White color, accentuate areas not accessed by the crew members.
- Finish your model as you usually do. Give a mist of White wash to some decals after they are dry for added realism.
- Before you begin, remember, patience pays.



Messerschmitt Bf 109 F-2 'White 2' W. Nr. 5485 Lt. Max-Helmuth Ostermann, 7./JG 54. Autumn 1941 'White 2' is camouflaged in standard RLM 74/75/76 with additional mottling on the fuselage in RLM 74/75. At this point in time Ostermann had achieved 33 victories. We are providing you an extra cross # 4 in case you decide to paint the Yellow band. It looks so much better!
