Notes: Exhaust shroud fitted. Rear view mirror mounted on starboard windshield framing. Solid, non-perforated breather plate.

Colors*: Overall natural metal. Invasion stripes on lower fuselage and wings with center White stripe on wings toned down. Black theater ID bands on bottom of horizontal tail surfaces. Exhaust shrouds and canopy framing: Natural metal. Upper surface: Field applied OD and RAF Green on wings, tail surfaces and upper fuselage. Nose, spinner and leading edge of wings around guns: Yellow. Anti-glare panel: OD. Breather Plate: Black
