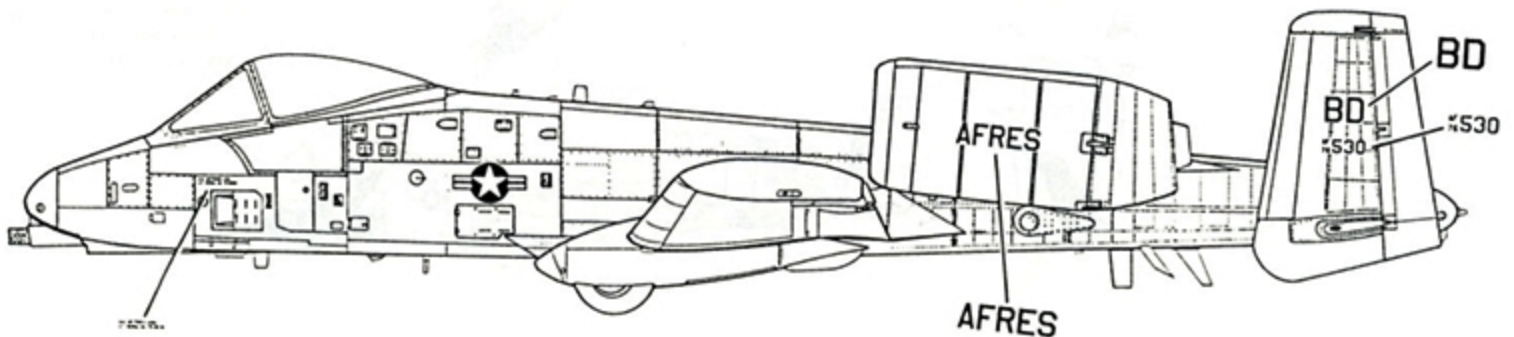
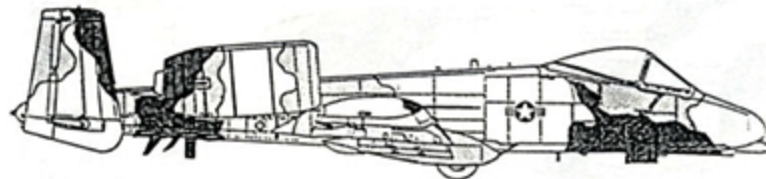
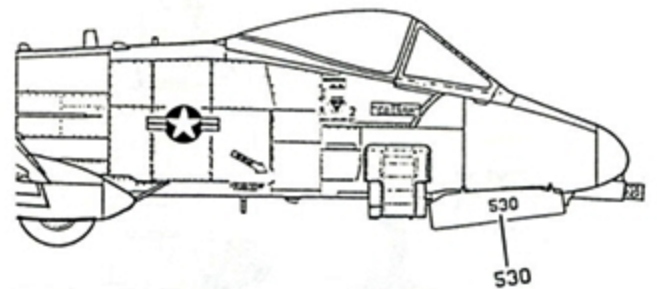
Armament: A-10s operating in the Gulf always carried 2 Alm-9s on a single Phantom style twin rack on the furthest outboard pylon (usually port). This was bolstered by the use of an AN/ALQ-119 Jammer pod on the opposing outboard pylon (usually starboard). Additional offensive weapons usually included a pair of AGM-65 Maverick missiles (1 each on first pylon outboard of main gear wells). Remaining pylons usually carried MK 20 Rockeye CBUs and occasionally MK 82 Slick and Snakeye bombs.

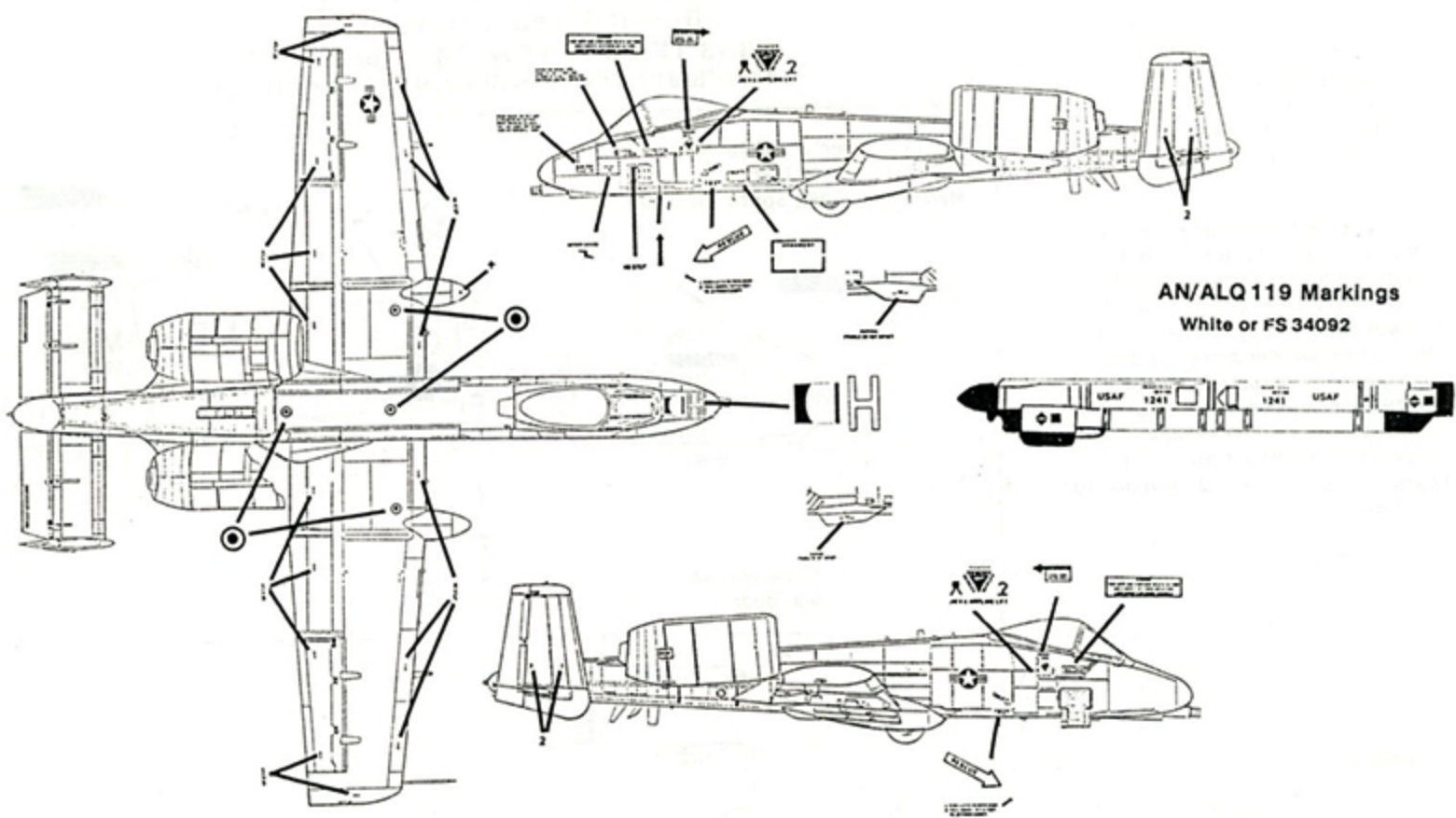
#1 Tank Killer' A-10A 78-0668

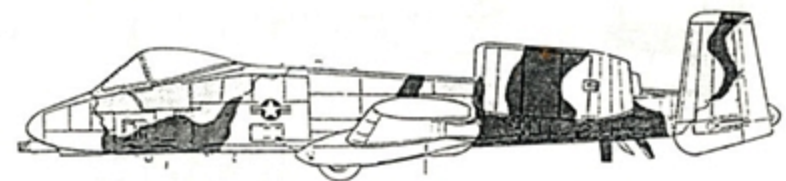

The scheme consisted of lt. gray, med. gray, & dk gray applied using the A-10 tactical paint pattern. Neither scheme was chosen to replace the 'Lizard Scheme' and no specially painted 'Warthogs' saw combat.

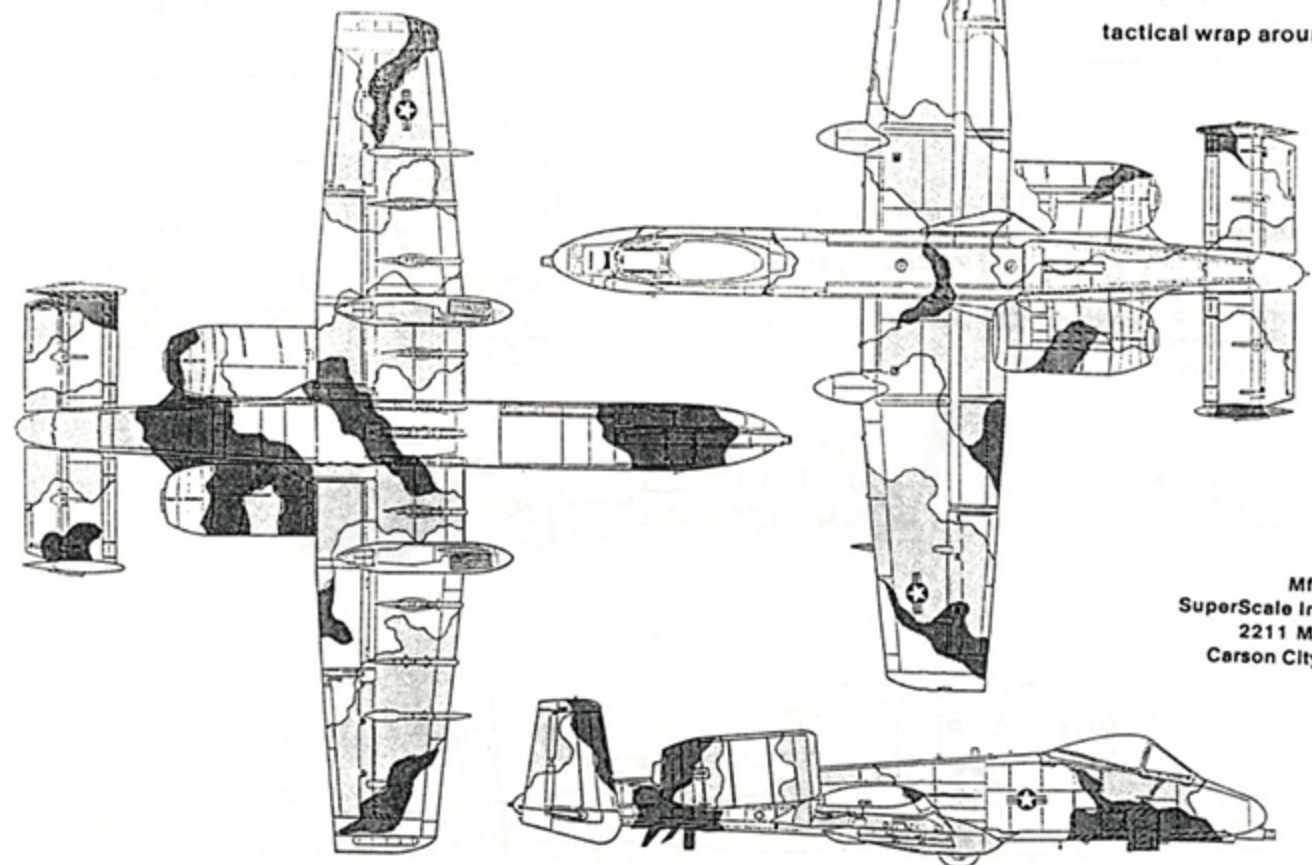


AN/ALQ 119 Markings
