

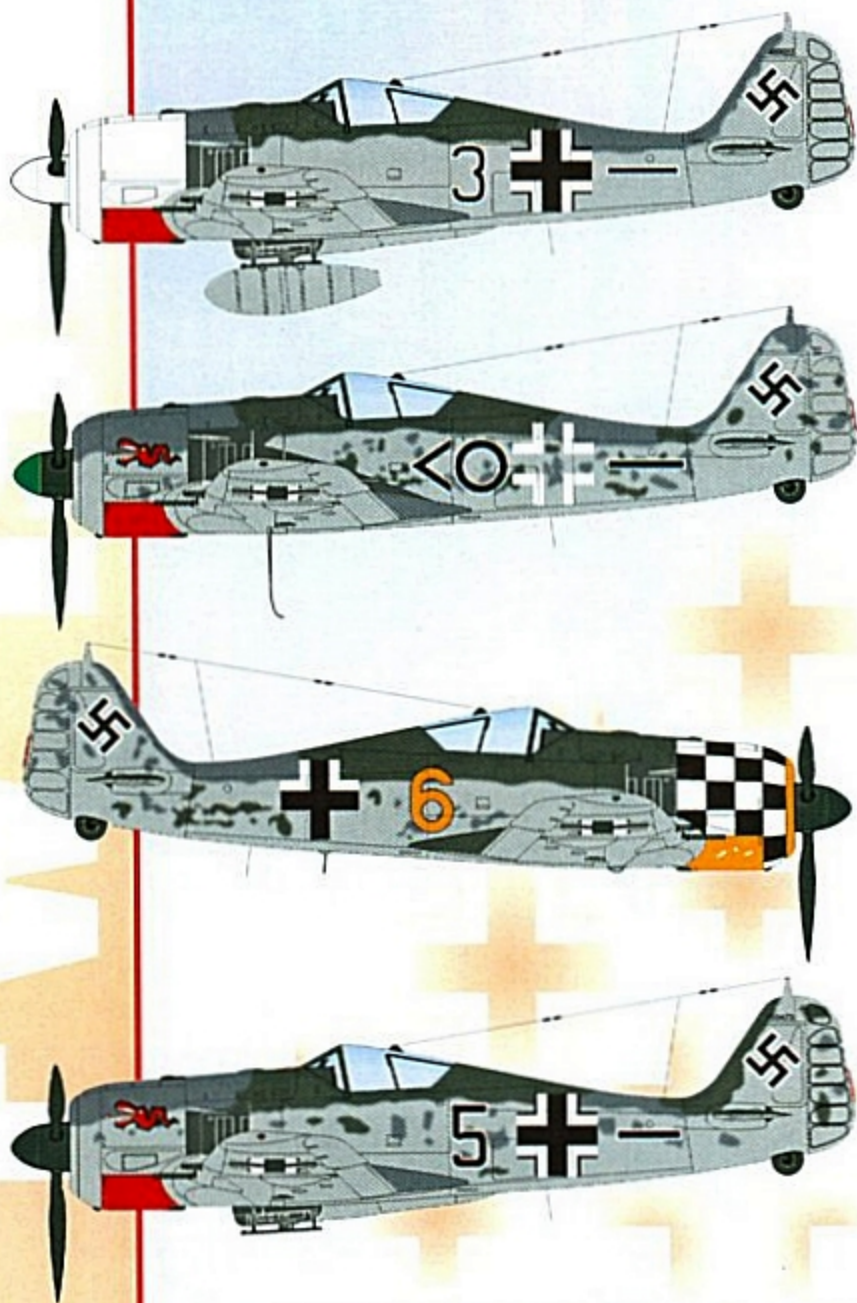

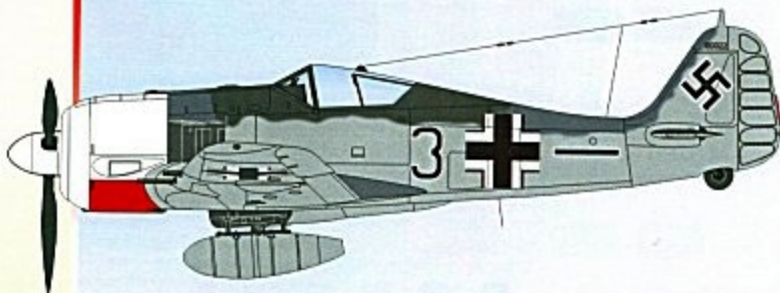

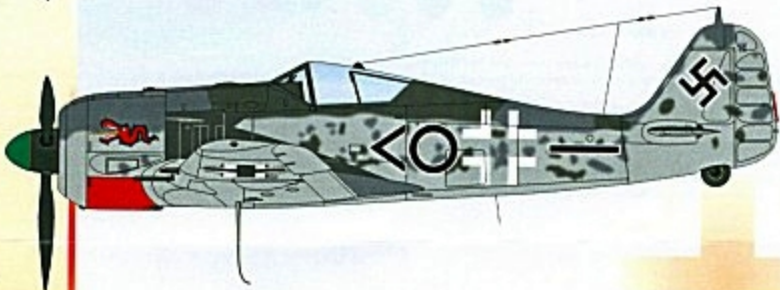
BUTCHER BIRDS OF JG-1

A/C#1. FW-190 A-6, W. Nr. 410022, of 5/JG1. Flown by Lt. Fritz Wegner during late 1943. White cowling & spinner with RLM 70 propeller. Red lower cowlings. We are not positive of the W. Nr. of this A/C (last 2 digits).



A/C#2. FW-190 A-5, W. Nr. unknown, 11/JG1. Flown by Gruppen T. O. Lt. Rudiger Kirchmayr, Summer of 1942. Red lower cowlings and Green spinner tip.



NOTE:
 Standard Luftwaffe Day Fighter camouflage of RLM 74/75/76 on all these A/C. Very light fuselage mottling.

A/C#3. FW-190 A-4, W. Nr. unknown, 3/JG1. Belly landed at Schiphol late June, early July. Checkered nose with Yellow number, lower cowling and cowling ring. RLM 70 spinner/propeller. Possibly a bird of 1/JG1 (checkered nose) recently transferred to 3/JG1 (Yellow numbers).



A/C#4. FW-190 A-6, W. Nr. 550473.5/JG1, Flown by Fw. Walter Nietzche, Rheine, Summer of 1943. RLM 70 propeller/spinner. Red lower cowling. A/C shot down and pilot killed the night of 27-28 September 1943.
