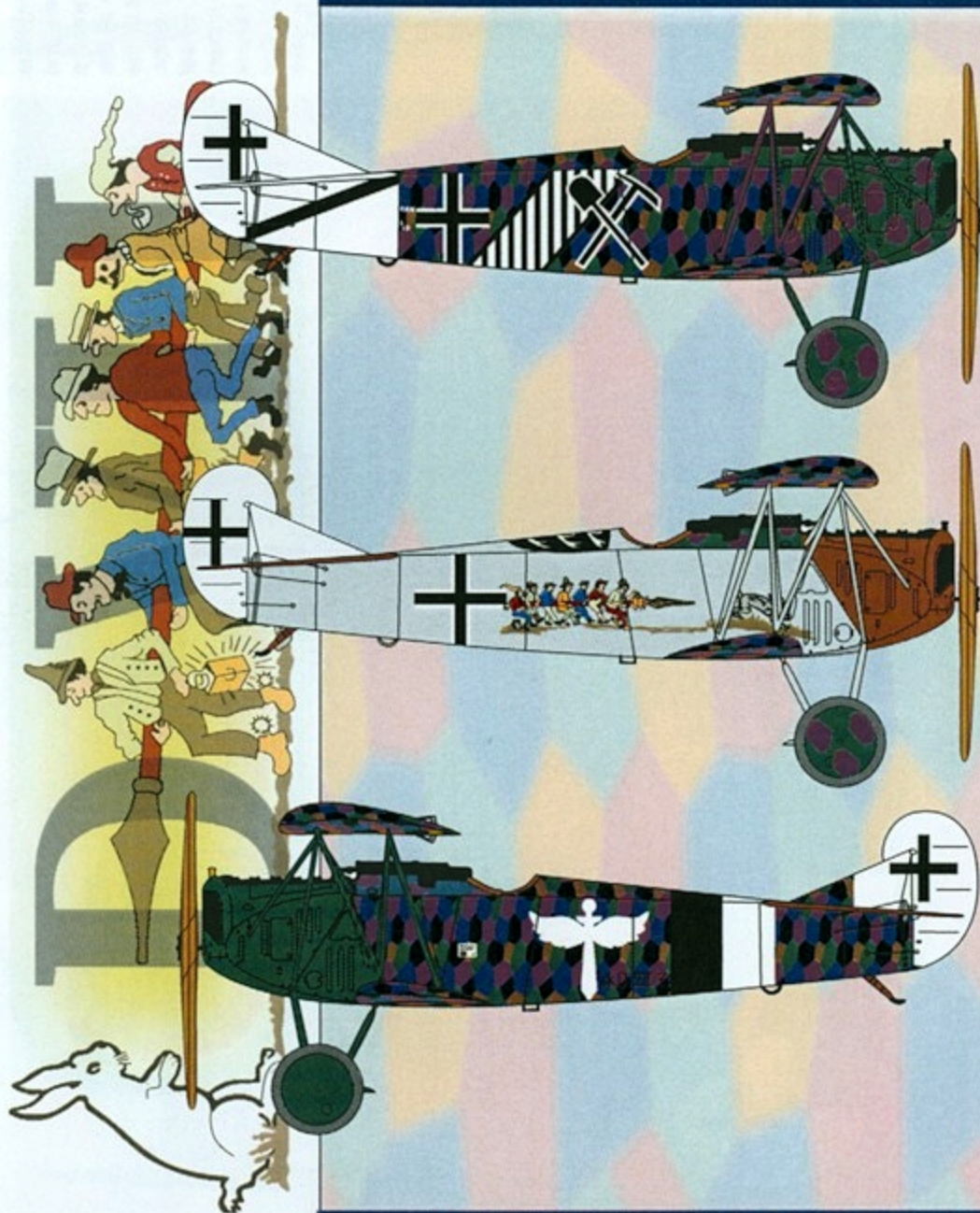

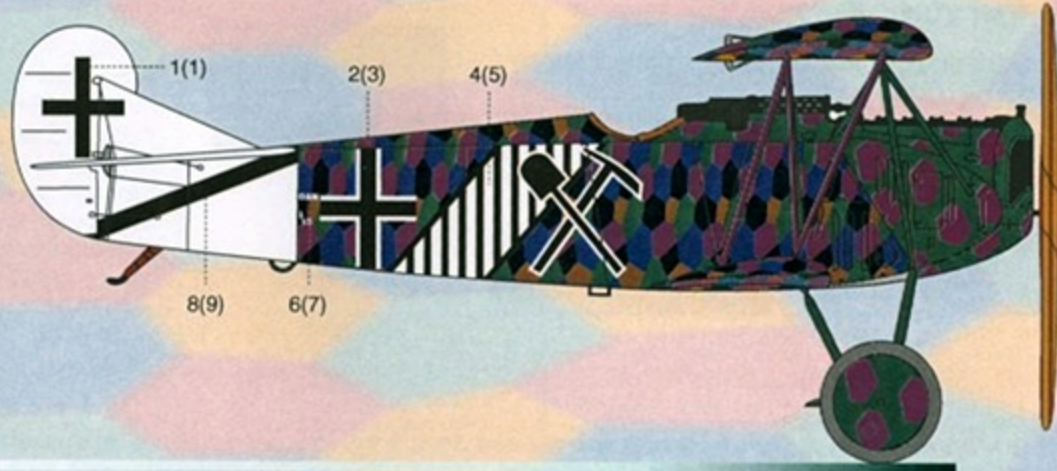




# Colorful Fokkers

PART I

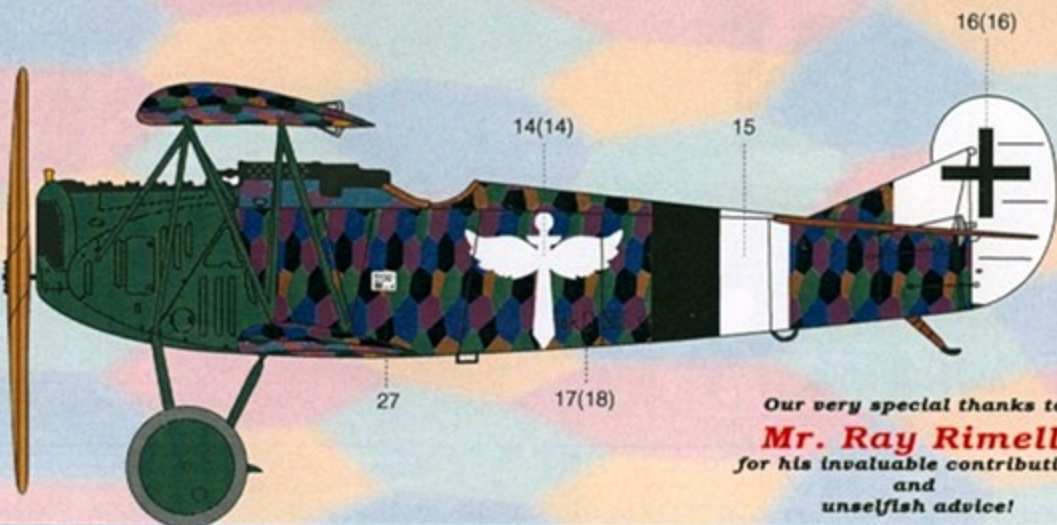
 Fokker DVII (OAW), Flown by UFFZ. Niemczyk (or Nimszyk), Jasta 50, 1918. A/C is covered in 4 color Lozenge Fabric, with Green/Mauve patches on cowling, axle wing and wheel covers. Jasta 50's markings included Black diagonal bands on stabilizers and rear fuselage section. Shovel and pick were pilot's personal markings. Wing fuselage and landing gear struts are Green while wing struts are Mauve. Machine gun panel seems to be Green.



 Fokker DVII (OAW) s/n 4649/18 of Jasta 65, 1918. Flown by Gef Wilhelm Scheutzel. The mysterious Seven Swabians decorate this beautiful A/C over a Light Blue Gray fuselage. Engine panels and horizontal stabs seem to wear a Chocolate Brown color with all the landing gear and wing strut in the same fuselage Blue Gray color. Machine gun panel and wheel covers display the well known OAW DK Green and Mauve Lozenge pattern. It is possible that the landing gear wing may have displayed the same pattern. OK!



 Well, here is an easy one! Fokker DVII F, Jasta 66, 1918. Flown by VzFz Heinrich Stor. Late Fokker built 'D' VII, covered with a 4 color Lozenge Fabric, with engine panels, axle wing, wheel covers and struts in Fokker Dk. Green.
