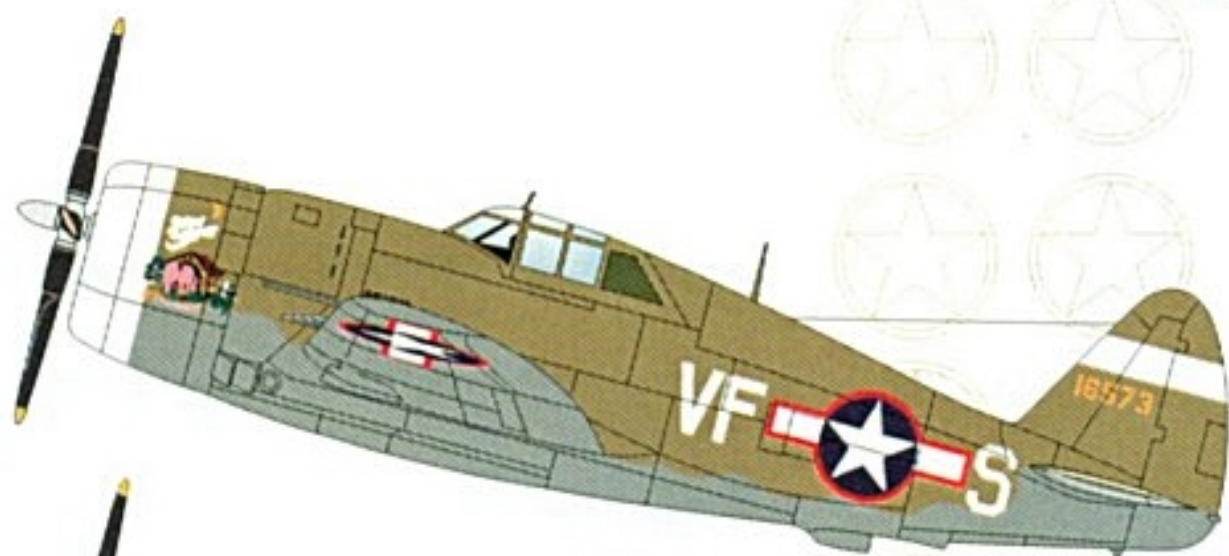

## Debden Jugs Pt. I



Suggested Kit: Academy/Hasegawa P-47D Razorback



1. P-47C-5-RE 41-6573 BEVOAPABML, flown by Lt Peter Lehman, 336th FS in January of 1944. Olive Drab 41 over Neutral Gray 43 with White ETO ID bands on cowl and all tail surfaces. Oversized Red-bordered national insignia under both wings. Codes on the right side read SVVF. Individual code letter S repeated in Black under the nose. A good example of why you should never underestimate your crew chief's ingenuity, the pilot said, obviously in jest, that he wanted a Bird's Eye-View Of A Pig's Ass By Moon Light (BEVOAPABML), on the nose of his P-47. He got his wish!



**Note differences in cowl flaps.**

3. P-47C-5-RE 41-6538 Wela Kahao flown by Capt William Hollander, 334th FS in May of 1943. Camouflaged in Olive Drab 41 and Neutral Gray 43. White ETO ID bands on cowl and all tail surfaces. Oversized cocarde insignia under both wings; fuselage cocardes outlined in yellow. Codes on the right side read BQPB. Individual code letter B repeated in black under the nose. Note small factory installed rear-view mirror.



Notice differences in cowl flaps.

3. P-47D-1-RE 42-7876 Miss Dallas as flown by Lt Victor France, 334th FS in June, 1943. Olive Drab 41 over Neutral Gray 43 with white ETO ID bands on cowl and all tail surfaces. Oversized cocarde national insignia under both wings. Codes on the right side read KVQP; the black individual code letter K outlined in yellow under the nose. France's crew chief was Sgt. Don Allen who did the squadron's nose art, some of the finest in the ETO. Note the painted wheel covers, factory rear-view mirror and the whip antenna replacing the mast.



2. P-47C-5-RE 41-6410 Little Batch flown by Capt Gil Ross, 334th FS, in July of 1943. Camouflaged in Olive Drab 41 and Neutral Gray 43. White ETO ID bands on cowl and all tail surfaces. Oversized cocarde national insignia under both wings, fuselage cocardes outlined in yellow. Codes on the right side read YVQP. Individual code letter Y repeated under the nose. RAF style rear-view mirror.



4. P-47D-5-RE 42-74686 of Maj Roy Evans, Commander of the 335th FS, early September, 1943. Painted Olive Drab 41 and Neutral Gray 43 with white ETO ID bands on the cowl and all tail surfaces. Oversized red-bordered national insignia under both wings. Codes on the right side read EYWD; the E repeated under the nose in black. The Eagle on both sides of the nose was the emblem of the RAF American Eagle Squadrons, 1940-1942. Note the whip antenna and Republic rear-view mirror.
