





Texans over Korea







Aircraft 1 - AT-6D 42-85074, 6147 TC Group, Seoul City Airport, October 1952. Pilot unknown. Natural metal finish with Olive Drab antiglare panel. Paint cowl Yellow, apply decal 1, then carefully mask and paint antiglare panel. Note Black and Yellow wing stripes.


Aircraft 2 - LT-6G 49-3550 "Moan'n Lisa', 6148 TACS, Chunchon, 1952. Pilot unknown. Polished natural metal finish with Olive Drab antiglare panel. Note unpainted spinner.


Aircraft 3 - SNJ-5C BuNo. 51683, Joint Operations Center/Korea. Natural metal finish with worn Flat Black antiglare panel. Note lettering on port side of tail was applied at an angle. Lettering on starboard side was straight. Apply decals 28a and 28b to align with decal 26. Then wrap decal 28c around scoop and trim.

Aircraft 4 - LT-6D 49-3556 'Peggy', 6148 TACS, Chunchon, 1952. Pilot unknown. Overall Light Gray (FS 36495?) with Olive Drab antiglare panel. Aircraft did not carry wheel hub and gear door markings until later in its career.


KOREAN T-6

Aircraft 5 - AT-6D 42-85163, 6147 TACS Taegu, 1950. Pilot unknown. Well worn Olive Drab uppersurfaces and Neutral Gray undersurfaces. Note this aircraft had its cowl replaced at one point, which inadvertently changed the name to 'Pat'. We have provided the name in two parts to accomodate the change.

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Decaling: Apply decals only to a glossy surface.

- 1. With a sharp scissors or knife, carefully cut item to be used, being careful of not cutting off the clear film around it or that belonging to an adjacent item.
- 2. Submerge in clean tap water for over 10 seconds and lay over an absorbent paper towel. Decal will slide freely in about 20 seconds. Do not leave decal on water bowl over ten seconds, or adhesive quality will suffer.
- 3. With a clean brush, apply a setting solution to the area where the decal will finally lay. (Micro, Super or Aero Set will do). With a clean pointed brush slide the decal on to the final area. Allow the setting solution to dry for about 3-5 minutes.
- 4. With another clean brush, apply a solvent solution over the decal (Micro, Super or Aero Sol will do). Do this if possible in one stroke since your decal will soften up and wrinkle immediately. This is an important step in the process, whatever you do DO NOT TOUCH THE DECAL, after this process until it is totally dry, preferably overnight.
- 5. When thoroughly dry, rinse your model with tap water and mild soap to wash of excess glue.
- 6. Finish your model with the desired final coat (gloss, flat, or semi-gloss).

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
